

Mrs. Clinkscales Speaker At Rotary

Junior Woman's Club Guests at Meeting Last Week

Members of the Edenton Junior Woman's Club were guests of the Rotary Club at its regular meeting Thursday of last week, when the principal speaker was Mrs. Pauline Clinkscales, history teacher in the Elizabeth City High School. Mrs. Clinkscales was accompanied and introduced to the Rotarians and their guests by J. G. McCracken, superintendent of Elizabeth City schools.

Mrs. Clinkscales directed a portion of her remarks to the United Nations charter, calling attention to the various accomplishments made by the instrument. "Through the United Nations charter goes in the right direction," said Mrs. Clinkscales, "it does not go far enough." Giving credit to the accomplishments of the charter, the speaker said, "the world cannot change in a day, a week or a year, but we can have security until it does change."

In reference to Communism, Mrs. Clinkscales said, "we need to acquire all the information possible about it. We know so little and we need to know so much. We must expose and obstruct all groups that attempt to undermine our country. We study cancer and other contagious diseases and why to fight them, why not study Communism so that we can right it?"

Citing conditions as they now exist in various parts of the earth, Mrs. Clinkscales said, "Today we have our second chance for peace. We are either going to stamp out war or we are going to stamp out the world. We are either going to live in peace or in pieces."

"Unless we can bring about a reformation or revolution, we cannot succeed. There must be a reformation or revolution—a spiritual and moral reformation or revolution if we are to survive."

At the conclusion of her address President J. E. Wood of the Rotary Club expressed the opinion that it would be a fine thing if it were possible to have Mrs. Clinkscales deliver the same address all over the state and nation as well.
