

4-H Club Members Showing Progress In Poultry Chain

According to Assistant County Agent Robert S. Marsh, most of the 4-H club members who are members of the poultry chain are doing very

well with their projects. Since the chickens were hatched approximately a month earlier than before, they are well advanced. The day old chicks were delivered to the club members on February 23, and are now well advanced. Club members who are members of the 4-H Poultry Chain are urged to keep plenty of growing mash before their birds at all times and not overfeed with grain. Cracked corn or wheat should only be fed late in the afternoon, and only in the amount that the chickens will clean up in ap-

proximately 10 or 15 minutes. Visits were made to all club members who are in the Poultry Chain last week by Mr. Marsh. Several flocks were vaccinated for protection against fowl pox. In some cases the club members' parents have old chickens which they plan to dispose of shortly, and therefore none of the chickens on this farm were vaccinated. The Club member's flock will be vaccinated as soon as the old birds are disposed of. Experience is rarely valued by those who need it most.

State College Publishes Cotton Insect Bulletin

A new 16-page full-color bulletin on cotton insect pests and their control was published this week by the State College Extension Service. Copies of the publication are available free on request. Dr. Walter M. Kulash, entomologist for the North Carolina Agricultural Experiment Station, prepared the text. Six colored plates of the major cotton insect pests found in North Carolina were furnished by the Di-

vision of Cotton Insects, Bureau of Entomology and Plant Quarantines, of the U. S. Department of Agriculture and Extension Service of the Clemson Agricultural College, Clemson, S. C. In brief foreward, Dr. I. O. Schaub, director of the Extension Service, asserts that control of insects is very important to the efficient production of cotton in North Carolina, since about 17 per cent of the crop is annually destroyed by insects.
