

First Showing Of "The Lost Colony" Scheduled July 1st

56 Performances Planned to Be Presented During Season

Paul Green's symphonic drama, "The Lost Colony," which will have its 10th anniversary season premiere on Saturday night, July 1 this year will present 56 performances before the finale scheduled for Labor Day Eve on September 3, it was stated this week by the show's general manager John W. Parker of the Carolina Playmakers in Chapel Hill.

The weekly production schedule this year calls for six performances weekly, Tuesday through Sunday, he stated.

Tuesdays will again be Celebrity Nights at the Waterside Theater and outstanding personalities of stage, screen and public life will make appearances as guest actors.

First Celebrity Nights, an idea of Kay Kyser, famed Tar Heel-born band leader and radio star were presented last year with Kyser taking leading

roles in conducting same. He appeared as guest actor on several occasions playing the role of master of Queen's ceremonies or Wanchese along with other outstanding personalities including his beautiful and talented wife Georgia Carroll, Betty Smith, author of A Tree Grows In Brooklyn, Bill Cox, sports editor and Indian authority, Under Secretary of State James E. Webb, Jonathan Daniels, James Street and others.

Already local officials of Roanoke Island Historical Association, sponsors of the show, are busy on Roanoke Island making preparations for the 10th season premiere on July 1.

Bulletin Published On Turkey Raising

"Higher Farm Income with Turkeys," a 40-page bulletin giving results of a study of turkey production in Anson and Union Counties, was published this week by the North Carolina Agricultural Experiment Station.

The publication, illustrated with charts and graphs, was prepared by

Walter H. Pierce, associate agricultural economist. The study was undertaken to obtain information that could be used in planning farm organizations which include turkeys. Anson and Union were selected because they comprise one of the main turkey-producing areas in the State.

Pierce points out that turkey production has increased rapidly in North Carolina during recent years. Cash income from the sale of turkeys advanced from an annual average of slightly more than a half million dollars before World War II to 2.6 million dollars in 1948.

2,259 Rehabilitated In State During 1949

Rate of Earnings Is Increased From \$411.32 To \$2,077.92

During the past fiscal year, 2,259 disabled men and women were rehabilitated into gainful employment by the North Carolina agency for Vocational Rehabilitation of disabled civilians.

The announcement came from Chas. H. Warren, Director of Vocational Rehabilitation at Raleigh.

Of those rehabilitated 594 were unemployed at the time services were started, and 1,053 had never worked or had worked only part time. The 612 who were on jobs when their rehabilitation was started were in danger of losing their jobs through disability, were endangering their own health or safety and that of others, or were in unsuitable and unsatisfactory employment, Mr. Warren said.

Mr. Warren estimated that the annual rate of earnings of the rehabilitated group was increased from \$411.32 before rehabilitation to \$2,077.92 after rehabilitation. This increased rate of earning will continue to add to the purchasing power of the State for years, Mr. Warren said. In contrast, he said, rehabilitation costs are paid only once and last year averaged

\$362.96 per fully rehabilitated case. The Federal government paid \$518,840.72 of the cost of operating the States' program; the State, \$301,090.40.

In Chowan County 11 persons were rehabilitated, with none awaiting service.
