## Safety On Farms Stressed At Boys **4-H Club Meetings**

## **Demonstrations** Point Out Danger Of Carelessness

Importance of farm safety was re-cently demonstrated to Chowan 4-H boys at the meetings this week. Farm accidents take a toll of one life every hour of the day, or at least 17,500 lives per year throughout the country. The one word which best des-cribes the cause of all accidents on the farm and in the farm home is "Carelessness." Accidents don't just happen; they are caused. There are three major considerations to be studied in the care of every farm accident. How it happened When it accident; How it happened, Why it happened, and How it could have been prevented.

Farm fires take great tolls of human lives and property annually. There are several precautions which every 4-H club member and his parents can observe to reduce the fire hazards in the farm home and in other farm buildings. Oily rags and mops should never be left piled together inside a building, but should be stored in a safe place on the porch or in a shed. Stairways should be adequately lighted and kept free of magazines, books, newspapers, brooms, dust pans and other such materials.



### PLANT PROPERLY TREATED COTTONSEED

The chance for a good stand of cotton with the first planting can be increased greatly when seed that has been treated properly with a recommended seed disinfectant is planted.

The circles in the picture above illustrate the difference seed treating may make. Treated seed and seedlings are less apt to suffer from seed decay, damping-off or sore-shin.

The small cost of treating is unimportant when compared with the expense of soil preparation, fertilizers, labor and equipment needed to produce a good crop. Less than 10c per acre spent for seed protection can often mean many dollars profit when the crop is brought to the gin.
