Charlie Small Adds Beef Cattle Enterprise To Farm At Advance

Charlie Small, of Advance community, has begun putting some of his eggs in another basket by adding a beef cattle enterprise to his farming operation. During the last year Mr. Small has seeded about 15 acres or more to Ladino clover and grass pasture. He purchased about 20 good grade heifers and a registered Hereford bull. Mr. Small made the mistake of breeding some of his heifers too early but in general he had a fair calf crop this spring. He plans to bring his pastures up to about 40 or more acres for a herd of between 30 to 40 breeders. Extension plans for constructing a feeding shed were delivered to him last week. The shed will provide approximately 50 square feet of space for each animal when

the maximum herd is attained. Hay will be stored in the loft space above and be fed down through racks for self-feeding. A bountiful water supply is being provided in the plan. Mr. Small grows quite an acreage of sweet corn for market and plans to feed the corn forage to his beef cattle.

Mr. Small's farming operation consists of the production of peanuts, cotton, tobacco, vegetable crops, corn, hogs and beef cattle at the present time. With this diversification he hopes to have a well balanced farming operation.

NARROW ESCAPE

George Watkins of Oxford was fortunate to escape serious injury Friday night during an electrical storm when his Cadillac left the highway near Chowan Hospital and turned over several times.

The car was badly damaged and Watkins was treated in the hospital for injuries not regarded as serious.

Marine Called By Draft In Mexico

Marine Corporal Miguel E. Bustamante, a citizen of Mexico, is to be discharged from the Corps to allow him to fulfill his obligations under Mexican draft laws.

The corporal came to the United States from Mexico City in 1947 to attend Catholic University in Washington, D. C. He graduated last year with a B. A. E. degree and decided to remain in the country to follow his profession as an engineer.

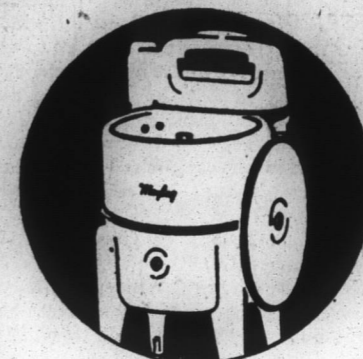
Inducted, via the draft law, into the Marine Corps last September, he was assigned to the Second Marine Air Wing and worked as an aircraft mechanic with Marine Aircraft Group Eleven at the Marine Corps Air Facility at Edenton, N. C.

A few months ago, the corporal received a letter from the Mexican Embassy in Washington informing him

that he was to be inducted into the Armed Services of Mexico. His desire to remain with the Marine Corps received the support of his commanding officer but international considerations

and policy prevailed—he will leave for Mexico shortly for one year's service with the Mexican Army.
