The Department in summarizing violations for June, also reported 698 convictions for faulty esuipment; 552

for failing to stop for stop signs; 299 for improper passing; 270 for bad lights; 123 for following too closely; and 104 for failing to yield the right-

Other offenses, including running red lights, failing to give hand signal, improper turns, driving on wrong side of road, parking on highway without lights, failing to stop at intersections, and disregard of the safety and rights of others brought the June totals to 8,704 North Carolinians
