

### 3,257 Arrested For Speeding In June

### 1,494 Tangle With Law For Not Having Operator's License

During June the Department of Motor Vehicles reports 3,257 Tar Heel motorists were arrested and convicted for speeding. Another 1,494 faced court action for driving without an operator's permit and 1,404 were convicted of reckless driving.

The Department in summarizing violations for June, also reported 698 convictions for faulty equipment; 552

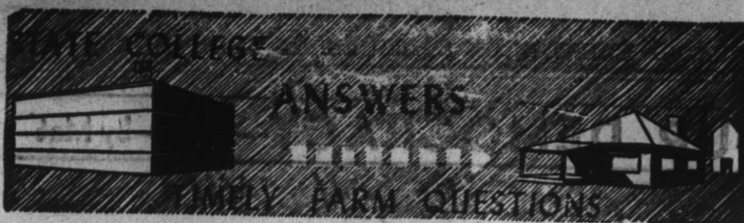
for failing to stop for stop signs; 299 for improper passing; 270 for bad lights; 123 for following too closely; and 104 for failing to yield the right-of-way.

Other offenses, including running red lights, failing to give hand signal, improper turns, driving on wrong side of road, parking on highway without lights, failing to stop at intersections, and disregard of the safety and rights of others brought the June totals to 8,704 North Carolinians found guilty of moving violations.

Out of state drivers convicted added 1,322 making a grand total of 10,026.

STATE—College ANSWERS (Since National Farm Safety Week is scheduled for July 20-26, this week's column deals with safety on the farm).

Question—How many rural accidents occur each year?

Answer—About 15,000 farm residents die and about 1,300,000 are injured in rural accidents each year.

Question—How many farmers are killed in work accidents each year?

Answer—About 4,000.

Question—What's the toll in farm

motor vehicle accidents?

Answer—At present rates, about 6,000 farm residents die and 220,000 suffer injuries in operating motor vehicles each year.

Question—Is there safety in the farm home?

Answer—The annual toll from accidents in the farm home is about 4,000 persons. Falls, burning, and poisoning are the chief home accident causes.

Question—What's the farm accident rate by the clock?

Answer—There are 41 farm accident

obituary notices every day. Every 24 seconds during the year a disabling injury will strike some unlucky farm person.

Question—What's the cost in money?

Answer—About one billion dollars. Fire alone destroys four farm buildings every hour of every day.

Question—What can be done to reduce the accident toll?

Answer—Industry has safety systems and safety inspectors which farms don't have. There's only one answer: Every farm family must become conscious of the need for safety and do everything possible to promote it.

### 16,857 Given License To Drive In June

Driver license examiners of the Department of Motor Vehicles issued 16,857 licenses during June including renewals, duplicates, and originals. Of the total 10,241 were original operator's permits; 2,744 duplicate operator's permits; 973 original chauffeur's licenses; 77 duplicate chauffeur's licenses; and 2,347 renewals of chauffeur's licenses.

The examiners collected revenue in the amount of \$76,232.88 of which \$66,686.90 came from original operator's permits.

They also reported 449 suspensions and 867 revocations during the month.
