N. C. Motor Vehicle **Deaths Are Double National Average**

Nearly 8 Die For Every 100 Million Miles of Travel

Statistically speaking almost eight persons were killed per 100 million miles of vehicular travel in North Carolina during the first nine months of the year.

This means simply that for every 100 million miles of travel amassed by the state's more than 1.200,000 registered vehicles, nearly eight persons died as the results of an auto accident.

The exact figure, reported by the National Safety Council gave North Carolina a 7.8, considerably better than South Carolina's 12.5 and slightly worse than Virginia's 7.3.

Traffic fatalities over the nation were up 2 per cent as the third quarter closed. North Carolina's per centage increase over 1951 was exactly, double that of the national average -4 per cent.

The nation suffered 37,300 motor Carolina had 1,071.


