14,225 N. C. Licenses Revoked In 1952

Over Half of Revocations and Suspensions **Caused By Liquor**

That liquor can cause more than the morning after blues is clearly illustrated by a report from the Department of Motor Vehicles which showed over half of all drivers license revocations and suspensions in 1952 resulted from mixing liquor and gaso-

In all 20,632 Tar Heel motorists lost their legal driving privileges in 1952 with 9,697 convicted of drunk driving charges. Another 486 licenses were suspended following convictions of transporting liquor.

Other major violations, and subsequent loss of licenses, included in the year end report were: 934 for speeding over 75 mph; 725 for two offenses of speeding over 55 mph; 720 for driving after license revoked; 624 for reckless driving; 245 for driving after license suspended; and 233 for larceny of automobile.

Last year 1,602 motorists failed to maintain proof of financial responsibility and consequently lost their driving privileges, which is included in the

Total revocations for the year came to 14,225 and suspensions to 6,407.


