NANCY CARTER Tested RECIPES

TOP HAT CHEESE SOUFFLE
Dash cayenne pepper
1/2 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
1/2 cup CS evaporated milk
1/2 cup water
Separate eggs, putting whites into large bowl. Grate or cut cheese into thin pieces. Set oven at 300 degrees; grease a 1 1/2 quart casserole. Melt butter slowly, add flour, salt, cayenne and Worcestershire. Blend well. Take from heat and gradually stir in milk and water. Cook over low heat, stirring constantly, until thick and smooth. Keep heat low, add cheese, stir until melted; remove from heat. Beat egg whites until stiff but not dry, then beat yolks until light. Slowly STIR sauce into egg yolks and blend well. Carefully FOLD Cheese mixture into beaten whites. Pour into greased casserole. To give souffle a top hat, use tip of teaspoon to draw a circle in top—about 1/2-inch deep and 1-inch in from edge of dish. Set in center of a slow oven; bake 1 1/2 hours. Makes 4 to 6 servings.
