Governor Umstead

Chief Executive Designates March as Red Cross Month

Governor William B. Umstead, in issuing his first official proclamation since taking office, has designated March as Red Cross month in North Carolina and called upon all Tarheels to "give support to their Red Cross in its 1953 Fund Campaign."

The Governor's proclamation cited "the neighborly, humanitarian services of the American Red Cross" and pointed out that Red Cross "helps to keep alive in the minds and hearts of people the elements of service, sacrifice, love and mercy.'

At the time of issuing the proclamation, Governor Umstead received a report from K. C. Lattimer, ARC diing the 1951-52 fiscal year.

According to this report, almost 28,-000 active servicemen or members of their families called upon the Red Cross last year for welfare assistance, often involving such emergencies as illness, death, or pressing family

In handling these requests, home town chapters worked with staff assigned to Korean battle areas, military hospitals, and installations in the U. In addition to these servicemen, 5,500 Tarheel war veterans received claims or welfare assistance.

Chapters in 85 counties, Lattimer reported, collected 83,000 pints of tion on Internal Medicine, Dr. Stroud blood last year for the fighting forces and for civilian needs.

On January 1 this year, these chapters started stepping up their defense blood collections to obtain additional blood needed for processing into gamma globulin, which will be used in the prevention of paralysis from polio-myelitis. Chapters in all North Carolina counties now are collecting funds to help finance this program, which will cost the Red Cross around \$7,-000,000 for equipment, personnel, and

processing of blood. A total of 12,000 Tarheels qualified last year as Red Cross first aiders, as first aid instructors; 3,000 completed courses in home nursing; and 17,000 completed swimming and lifesaving courses. The state's schools have 480,000 students enrolled in the

funior Red Cross.

Volunteers in the state's 1112 Rec Cross chapters gave a total of 145,-000 hours of volunteer time last year, including 31,000 hours in military and veterans hospital.


