The Albemarle Potato Festival Association is sponsoring two contests for women and girls as part of the Festival Program on May 28-29 in Elizabeth City. I hope all of you good cooks and seamstresses will enter one, or both of these contests. Valuable county and district prizes will be offered but I do not have a list of these now. However, I am giving you other details so that you may decide on the potato recipe you'll use, and the garment you want to make.

Rules for the potato recipe contest follow:

1. Those entering the contest shall present the recipe and the prepared dish at a county elimination contest held during the first week in May.

2. The contestant may make only one entry in each class.

3. A Junior and Senior County Winner shall be selected for each class. In case of only one entry in a class, the entry may be declared a county winner if it meets the accepted standards of the judges.

4. All county winners shall bring their prepared dish to Elizabeth City on May 15 to be judged for 1st place winner in each Junior and Senior class. Out of the group one dish shall be selected for 1st place winner of the entire contest.

5. All county winners shall exhibit their prepared dishes along with their recipes at a cooking school held during the Festival.

6. The winners of the recipe contest shall be announced at the cooking school referred to above.

Date of notifying Home Economist of entering April 22.

The potato bag sewing contest rules follow:

1. Garment must be made by person entering.

2. Each person who enters must model the garment she has made.

3. All garments entered in contest must be made of the official potato bag which may be secured from Elizabeth City Chamber of Commerce for fifty cents each. There shall be no limit on the number of bags that

may be used.

4. A County Winner shall be selected for each Junior and Senior class. In case of only one entry in a class, the entry shall be declared a County Winner.

5. All County Winners will appear in a Style Show during the Potato Festival when they shall be judged for first place in each Junior and Senior class. Out of the group, one person shall be selected for 1st place winner of the entire contest.

Date of notifying Home Agent of entering, not later than May 1, 1953.

Home Demonstration Club members and others have been asked to make banners to be used during the Festival. If any club or individual is interested in making some of the banners please let me know by Monday, March 23. They will furnish the material and pay \$4.00 for making each unit of 5 street banners and one store front banner. Those who make them will be expected to sell the store front banners to the merchants in Elizabeth City.

EGGS 'N' CHIPS

4 Pick of the Nest eggs 1 can condensed cream of mushroom soup ¼ cup milk

2 tablespoons chopped onion 2 cups crushed potato chips (about 4 oz.) Salt and pepper

Hard cook, then peel and slice eggs. Blend soup, milk and onion. Put 1 cup crushed potato chips on bottom of well-buttered 1-quart casserole. Arrange egg slices on top of chips; cover with sauce. Top with remaining chips. Bake in a moderately hot oven, 400 degrees, about 25 minutes, or until sauce is bubbly. Makes 4 to 6 servings. Serve with buttered CS shoestring beets, CS Bartlett pear salad and Our Pride rolls.
