Minutes Of County Board Of Education

April 7, 1953.

The County Board of Education held its regular meeting Tuesday, April 7, 1953, in the office of the Superintendent at 10:00 A. M. The following members were present: G. B. Potter, Carey Evans, J. I. Boyce, G. E. Nixon and D. H. Berryman. The chairman, Mr. Potter, called the meeting to order by having the Secretary read the minutes of the previous meeting. The minutes as read were adopted by a motion made and passed.

The reports of the County School Treasurer and the local School Fund Treasurer were read, and same adopted by a motion made and passed.

The Superintendent reported that the old folding chairs in the Rocky Hock School were wanted by the Home Demonstration Clubs. A motion was made to allow the use of these chairs, excepting 25 or 25, which should be retained for general use around the school. The motion was passed.

The matter of roof repairs was called to the attention of the Board by the Superintendent. He presented Mr. Watson of the American Asbestos Products Company. Mr. Watson explained his roofing materials. The Board authorized the Superintendent to have the buildings inspected and have a written statement of the cost of materials and labor submitted.

The Superintendent read the bills

paid since last meeting in the amount of \$4,038.21. Upon motion made and passed, same were approved as follows:

Vocational teachers' salaries and travel, \$635.00; Chowan High School teachers' fund, \$48.72; veterans farmer training program, \$961.41; lunchroom program, \$803.97; division of purchase and contract, \$500.00; current expense items, \$1,084.11; total, \$4,038.21.

There being no further business motion to adjourn was made.

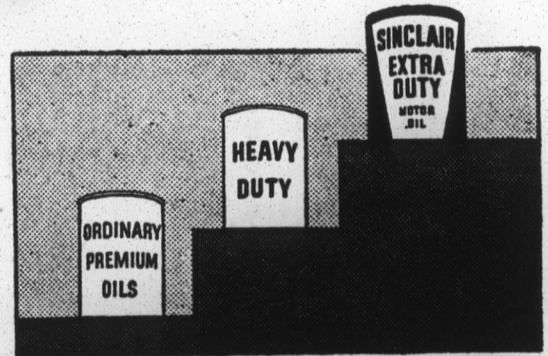
