Corn Root Worm Pest Of Peanuts

Demonstration on Control on Rodney Harrell's Farm

"The Southern corn root worm has been a serious insect pest of peanuts for many years," says Assistant County Agent Robert S. Marsh. "Several chemicals have shown very promising results in controlling this insect."

On Thursday of last week J. P.

Woodard, Extension peanut specialist, Dr. H. Eldon Scott, Extension entomologist, and Dr. J. R. Doggett, USDA entomologist, visited Rodney T. Harrell and started a result demonstration on controlling the corn root worm. They used a pound and one-half of actual heptachlor. This material, along with aldrin and dieldrin, have shown great promise in controlling this insect, and the results of this demonstration will be interesting to all Chowan peanut farmers who are bothered by this pest.
