

News About Clubs In Chowan County

I have found that freezing is one of the favorite methods of conserving fruits and vegetables used by many of you in the county. A number of you have asked for information regarding ascorbic acid. This is an anti-browning agent used to prevent darkening of apples, sweet cherries, light figs and peaches. Ascorbic acid is actually Vitamin C. As you know, that is a food element that we need every day. Our bodies do not store it, so we have to have a new supply daily. We get it from oranges, cantaloupe, green peppers, tomatoes, and some other fresh fruits and vegetables. It is called the "Fugitive" vitamin because it escapes from our food so easily. So when you add ascorbic acid to peaches and other fruits, you put more food value into them. Of course, you actually put it in peaches to keep them from turning dark. Some varieties of peaches darken more readily than others. Buy your ascorbic acid in powdered form (Vit. C tablets are all right—but expensive). You can buy pure ascorbic acid or you can buy mixtures which contain ascorbic acid. These mixtures are sold under various trade names. Use them according to directions that come with each one. Use 1 teaspoon of pure ascorbic acid to 1 quart of syrup for peaches. Don't let powdered ascorbic acid mixtures stand after preparing them. Use them immediately.

Leaking containers is another problem which sometimes arises. Some sweetened fruit juices never do freeze. They will seep out into the locker or home freezer if given even a tiny opening. Be sure that all containers are closed tightly. Press lids down firmly all around the top on rigid containers. If heat sealing is used on bags, be sure it works. Too much heat will destroy the seal; too little will not seal. An iron set on "rayon" is satisfactory. Gooseneck twists on polyethylene bags are all right if they are made properly. Test bags before using by filling with water. Mend any leaking place by heat sealing that spot before filling.

REQUEST FOR BIDS

Sealed proposals will be received by the Mayor and Town Council of the Town of Edenton, N. C., until 2:00 P. M., (EST) Thursday, August 6, 1953, for the furnishing of materials for the construction of a Water Treatment Plant.

The construction work will consist of the following:

SECTION IV

WATER TREATMENT PLANT

Water Treatment Plant, including three pumping units, chlorinator, chemical machine and equipment, miscellaneous piping, building and water retention basin, all excavation and fill.

Proposals must be sealed and marked "Water Treatment Plant for the Town of Edenton, N. C." All proposals must be submitted upon the blank forms provided in the copies of proposal, contract and specifications.

Each bid must be accompanied by a certified check for five percent (5%) of the amount of bid made payable to the Town of Edenton, N. C. In lieu of the 5% certified check, the bidder may offer a bidder's bond in the amount of 5% of the bid. All checks to be drawn on a Bank or Trust Company insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation.

Plans, copies of the Proposal, Contract and Specifications, etc., may be obtained upon application to the Engineer. A set of plans and specifications are on file at the Office of the Associated General Contractors, the Office of the Mayor, and the Office of the Engineer. Plans and specifications will be forwarded to the Contractor upon the receipt of a deposit of \$15.00, all of which will be returned upon the submission of a bona fide bid.

The bids for this proposed work will be received at the Office of the Mayor, Edenton, N. C., at which place, and at the time stated above, they will be publicly opened and read.

It will be the intention of the Town to award a contract for the construction of Section IV to one contractor. The right is reserved, however, to award a contract for the best interest of the Town of Edenton, N. C.

Consideration will be given only to bids of Contractors who submit evidence showing that they are licensed under "An Act to Regulate the Practice of General Contracting", ratified by the General Assembly of North Carolina on March 10, 1925, and so subsequently amended.

A performance bond is required in an amount equal to 100 percent of the contract price, conditioned upon the faithful performance of the contract and upon the payment in full of outstanding indebtedness in connection with the construction of the project.

The Town of Edenton, N. C., reserves the right to increase or diminish the quantities given in the proposal and to award contracts which appear to be for the best interest of the Town. The Town also reserves the right to hold any and all proposals for a period not to exceed thirty (30) days from the date of opening thereof. The Town of Edenton, N. C., also reserves the right to reject any or all bids and waive informalities.
