### DROUGHT REDUCES YIELD N. C. SWEET POTATOES

The severe drought was primarily responsible for the decrease in the average yield per acre of sweet potatoes from 105 bushels in 1954 to 93 bushels in 1955. The 1953 average yield per acre was the lowest since 1941, although the average yield per acre in 1951 was down to 94 bushels.

Sweet potato production in the State during 1954 totaled 3,999,000 bushels. This is 831,000 bushels or 17 percent less than the 1953 crop of 4,830,000 bushels.
