Better Vegetable Marketing Planned

gether in an organization with the determination to make it work, and stick together it will work."

Extension Marketing Specialists John Curtis and George Abshier explained the type of growers' organization deemed necessary and how the necessary capital may be raised to obtain the needed facilities.

The facilities needed were out-

lined. A blower attached at the end of the grading belt to clean the beans prior to grading. Two pairs of over-under scales for even-weighing packages. A cleaning and waxing machine for cucumbers and peppers. A chilling vat for sweet corn. Sufficient housing room would necessitate building an approximately 60 to 80 foot extension to the present shed.

"Number one vegetables must be grown in order to pack out number ones," Specialist Albert Banadyga said. "Adapted varieties must be used. Proper fertilization

is necessary. Insects and diseases must be controlled. The crop must be properly harvested. All of these are being done in many other areas and can be done here."

There were approximately 60 growers present at this meeting, County Agent C. W. Overman says. An expression vote was called for. A large majority voted in favor of the movement. Several obtained, but not votes were cast against.

Another meeting of the present stockholders of the Chowan Produce Exchange is called next Tuesday night, April 3, at 7:30 o'clock

at Rocky Hook Central School. It is deemed necessary to have at least a majority present or represented by proxies to take legal action to reorganize. The officers of the Exchange are anxious to have every stockholder present at this meeting.
