

Largest Crop Of Peanuts Expected Since 1952 Record

Estimate Places Production at 294 Million Pounds

N. C. peanut production as of September 1 is estimated at 294 million pounds compared with 204 million pounds in 1955 and 287 million for the 10-year average, according to the N. C. Crop Reporting Service. If a crop of this size is realized, it will be the largest since 1952 when, slightly more than 300 million pounds were produced.

The crop is mostly good to excellent and indications are for a yield of 1,500 pounds per acre compared with last year's low yield of 1,075 pounds and 1,218 pounds for the 10-year average. The low yield of 1955 was a result of heavy damage brought about by hurricanes.
