A congregational supper has been planned in his honor to be held in St. Paul's Episcopal Parish House at 7 o'clock Saturday. A group of candidates for confirmation will be presented to the Bishop for the Laying on of Hands at 11 o'clock Sunday by the Rev. George B. Holmes, rector of St. Paul's.

Bishop Wright received his early education in Wilmington, later receiving his B.A. from the University of South, Sewanee, Tennessee. He gained his B.D. and D. D. from Virginia Theological Seminary in Alexandria. He is the recipient of two other honorary degrees one from the University of the South and the other from Washington and Lee University.

Civil Service Exam For P. O. Positions

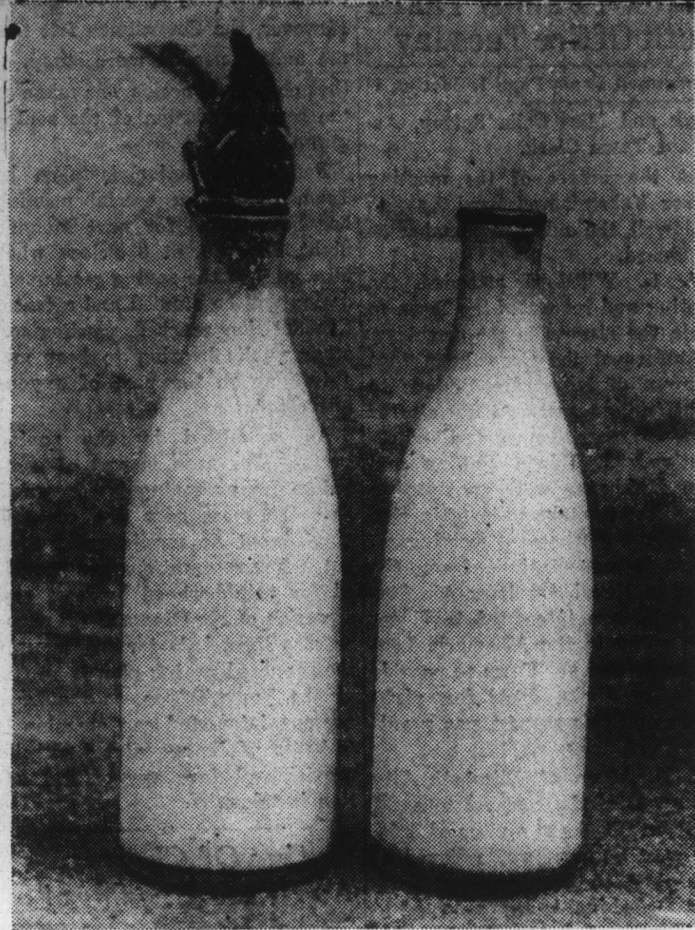
Applications Must Be Received Before June 4

The Fifth U. S. Civil Service Regional Office, Atlanta, Georgia, announces an open competitive examination for career or temporary appointment to the positions of substitute clerk, substitute carrier and substitute special delivery messenger in the Edenton Post Office.

Applications will be accepted from persons who reside within the delivery of the Edenton Post Office or who are bona fide patrons of such office. Persons employed in the post office will be considered bona fide patrons of the office. Applications must be received or post marked on or before June 4, 1957.

The beginning basic rate of pay is \$1.82 per hour. Applicants must have reached their 18th birthday on the closing date of acceptance of applications. This age limit does not apply to persons entitled to veterans' preference.

"The weeds are about to take over." This is a common expression this time of year in most sections of the state.

What about "weed killers"? Many of them are good but some are so highly selective that they must be used with great care. Well known 2, 4-D amine salt will kill most of the broad leaf weeds in the lawn but windblown spray may cause excessive damage to flowers and shrubs. For this reason I am suggesting that if you try any of the weed control materials, do so with great care and carefully follow the instructions given on the package. You can buy them under different trade names from your seedman.

or old hay. On the other hand peat moss, sawdust and cotton seed hulls will form an almost impervious layer over the area covered. Peat is an excellent organic material and I would rather work it into the soil than use it as a mulch. It will pay you to heavily mulch your tomatoes regardless of whether or not they are stalked. The same is true of azaleas, camellias, peppers, raspberries and many other home garden plants. The best treatment that you can give your raspberries is to mulch them with straw manure up to 20 tons per acre.

Before the mulching material is applied, it is a good plan to clean away all grass and weeds, fertilize the plants, if needed, then apply your mulch. This will really make your plants happy if you give them the needed water and protection from insect and disease pests. Timely hints: Keep after the insects and diseases. Pinch back your chrysanthemums to cause branching and root some cuttings. Use sharp, clean sand, shade, keep moist and protect from the wind. Watch your plants. Any that are in apparent good health but are showing signs of yellowing may need quickly available nitrogen.
