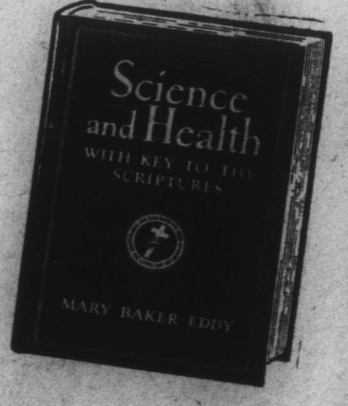
**Attend Funeral**

At the outset of the meeting Mayor Kehayes welcomed Raleigh Hollowell, the only new member on the Board.

T. B. Williford attended the meeting and requested the Town to grade the streets in the cemetery. He informed the Councilmen that a group of ladies are anxious to beautify the cemetery if the streets are made more symmetrical and attractive. J. Edwin Bufflap and John Mitchener were appointed a committee to make an investigation and report at the next meeting.

Two representatives from the Edenton Naval Auxiliary Air Station who are interested in Edenton's entry in the Albemarle League requested the Town to provide lights at Hicks Field for night games and this request was granted.

R. E. Aiken of Elizabeth City was awarded the contract to audit the town's books at a price of \$250.

Sidney Campen was relieved of his duties on the Zoning Adjustment Board due to being elected to the Board of Public Works. No successor was named at the meeting. Mayor Kehayes thanked Mr. Campen for his valuable services.

The major portion of the meeting was devoted to the zoning of the newly annexed area to Edenton. Geddes Potter, Chairman of the Zoning Commission, was present with proposed zoning regulations in the area which were given some

consideration by the Councilmen. However, the Councilmen felt that the matter needed more study, so that no official action was taken on the recommendation of the zoning group.

Before any action is taken by Town Council, a special meeting has been called for next Monday night, May 20, at 8 o'clock when all angles of the zoning recommendation will be studied and a tentative decision reached, pending another public hearing to hear any objections on the part of anyone interested.

As submitted by the zoning group. The area is sort of spotted so far as zoning is concerned. For the most part the area is singled out as purely residential, but a few reservations are provided for neighborhood business and a portion of the Brown's Mill property as light industry. A map of the proposed zoning plan is on file at the Town Office, so that any persons interested can examine it to become fully acquainted with its provisions before any official action is taken.
