

Local Pastor Resigns Post

The Rev. C. C. Boone, Jr., pastor of the Providence Baptist Church of Edenton, will preach his farewell sermon Sunday night, July 28, at 8 o'clock. Mr. Boone resigned to accept a call to the Union Baptist Church in Hempstead, Long Island, New York. His sermon will bring to a close ten years of successful pastorate at the local church. During Rev. Boone's stay he has completely reorganized the church, added an Educational Building and made many improvements to the church and adjoining properties.

Rev. Boone is president of the Pastors League, member of the trustee board of the Brown-Carter Library, member of the board of directors of the Chowan Credit Union, member of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People and a member of the John R. Page Lodge No. 13. In addition to this he was a teacher at the Washington County Union School of Roper and served as president of the County Teachers' Association. He is currently chairman of the Grammar Grade Section of the Northeastern District of the North Carolina Teachers Association and vice-chairman of the Grammar Grade Section of the North Carolina Teachers Association.

The church will sponsor a reception for the pastor and his family in recognition of his ten years of service on Friday night at the Educational Building, built under his leadership.
