Chowan County Presented Merit Certificate For Outstanding '57 Record Highway Traffic Safety

Chowan County has been presented a certificate of merit for "outstanding accomplishments in traffic safety" by the N. C. State Motor Club.

The handsome framed certificate was awarded in recognition of Chowan's record of having no highway fatalities during 1957, one of only five counties in the entire state with such a fatality-free record. The others are Hyde, Avery, Clay and Graham.

At a ceremony held in Sheriff J. A. Bunch's office Monday morning, the certificate was presented to Sheriff Bunch by Lewis Scruggs, Rocky Mount division manager, on behalf of the motor club and the National Automobile Association, with which it is affiliated.

Also participating in the ceremony were Jesse M. Wilson of Edenton, N. C. State Motor Club representative in Chowan, Hyde, Terrell and Washington counties, and Patrolman Thos. E. Vaughan and David O. Williams of the State Highway Patrol.

"It is a real pleasure to present this award to Chowan County for the fine record in traffic safety that has been achieved here," said Mr. Scruggs. "It takes the closest teamwork on the part of the county and city officials, law enforcement officers and the public in general to go that long without a fatality."

Mr. Scruggs also commended the newspapers for the forceful manner in which they consistently bring safety messages to the public's attention.

Chowan County Commissioners, was unable to attend the meeting.

In accepting the certificate Sheriff Bunch paid tribute to the highway patrolmen and local law enforcement officers for Chowan County's fine record.

The Councilmen received assessments for sidewalks on Carteret Street and the assessment roll was adopted.

During the meeting the Board of Public Works was authorized to furnish free lights for Albemarle League baseball games with two games a week scheduled.

R. E. Aiken of Elizabeth City was given the contract to audit the town's books at a price of \$125 for the Electric & Water Department and \$125 for the general fund.
