Don Evans.

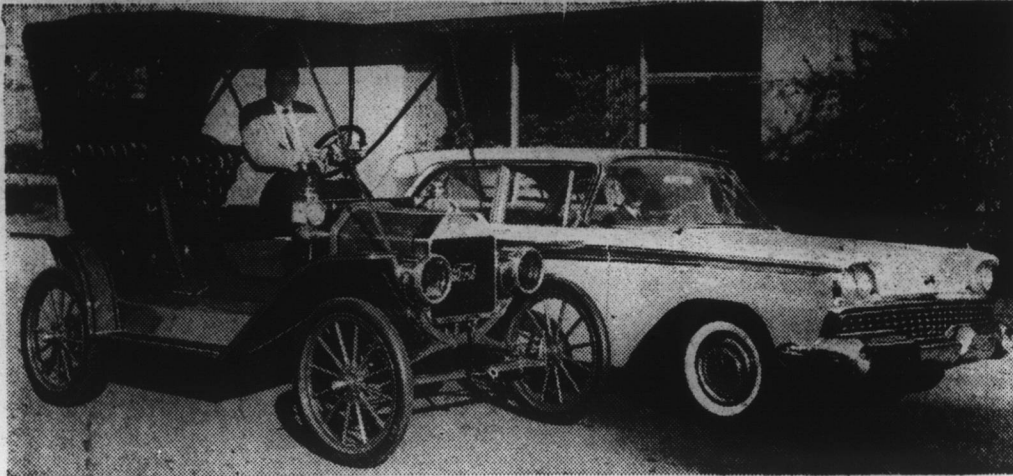
Dear Santa Claus:

### Poultry Inspectors Are Needed In State

The U. S. Department of Agriculture is in need of poultry inspectors to work in poultry processing plants in North Carolina and other southeastern states. Dr. J. K. Keim, Atlanta, in charge of the Agricultural Marketing Service's poultry inspection work in the Southeast, reports after January 1 all poultry meat and poultry products moving in interstate commerce must be federally inspected, which has created a need for poultry inspectors. A large number of applicants already have qualified for these positions, but there are still a

number of openings in North Carolina and nearby states, Keim said. The positions are of Civil Service GS-5 grade, with a beginning salary of \$4,040 annually. Interested persons may obtain a copy of the Civil Service Announcement No. 5-83-4, which explains the duties of poultry inspectors and necessary qualifications, and an application form, from the Board of Civil Service Examiners, U. S. Department of Agriculture, Room 22, 50 Seventh Street, N. E., Atlanta 123, Ga. Civil Service application card forms, 5000-AB, also are available at post offices.

Applicants who qualify on the basis of their qualifications and a written examination are placed on a Civil Service eligible list for employment. Since there will be a continuing need for inspectors, Dr. Keim said no closing date for receiving applications has been set.

### Town Council Proceedings

Edenton, N. C., Dec. 11, 1958. The Town Council met this day in regular session at 8 P. M. Members present: Mayor Ernest P. Kehayes, J. Clarence Leary, J. Edwin Bufflap, John Mitchener, George A. Byrum, Luther C. Parks and Raleigh B. Hollowell.

Minutes of the November meeting were approved as read. Motion was made by J. Clarence Leary, seconded by J. Edwin Bufflap, and duly carried that \$25 be appropriated for maintenance of a clock on Broad Street.

Motion was made by John Mitchener, Jr., seconded by J. Clarence Leary, and duly carried that George Privott be granted a permit to operate a taxicab for Wilford Jordan.

Motion was made by Raleigh B. Hollowell, seconded by J. Clarence Leary and duly carried that James K. Spruill be granted a permit to operate a taxicab for Charlie Jernigan.

Motion was made by George A. Byrum, seconded by J. Clarence Leary and duly carried that the following time schedule, as recommended by the Board of the various steps necessary to complete a sewage treatment

plant be submitted to the State Stream Sanitation Commission with an application for permit (extension of original permit) to continue discharging sewage into classified waters:

1—Engineers will be retained on or before July 8, 1959.

2—Reports and preliminary plans will be filed on or before November, 1959.

3—Construction will be begun on or before October, 1959.

Work will be completed and placed in operation on or before February 23, 1961.
