High Honor

Edenton and Chowan County as a whole has every reason to be proud of the announcement made this week that Chowan Hospital has been accredited for a period of one year by the Joint Commission of Accreditation of Hospitals of Chicago. It is The Herald's understanding that very few hospitals achieve this honor upon the first appli-It was Chowan Hospital's first application and following a very rigid survey the honor was subsequently announced.

The acceptance means that due to the splendid of the administrator, physicians, board of trustees and the entire hospital staff the public is assured that the hospital meets all the high standards expected for a hospital.

The accreditation is for a period of one year when another survey will be made and if this survey meets all the requirements the hospital will be accredited for a full term of three years.

All who are in any way connected with 'he hospital are elated over the accreditation announcement, and the public, too, should feel justly proud that the hospital has met all of the rigid qualifications, thus offering the facilities of a hospital of outstanding quality in all phases of hospital opera-

The Herald, therefore, congratulates all who have had any part in meeting the qualifications for accreditation and advances the opinion that when the next survey is made the accreditation will not be only for a year's probation but for a full term of three years.
