

Local Band Goes To Greensboro April 13

One of 70 Bands To Participate In State Band Contest

The Edenton Junior-Senior High School Band will leave Edenton Monday, April 13, at noon for Greensboro. They will spend Monday night in Greensboro and Tuesday morning will perform in the State Band Contest-Festival. The bands will begin performing on Monday morning at 9 o'clock, each band playing a maximum of 25 minutes. There will be 70 bands from all over the state who have qualified in their districts.

The judges for this year's contest are Dr. Kenneth Cuthbert of West Texas State College (formerly head of the Music Department at East Carolina College), Dale C. Harris, director of music for the Pontiac, Michigan City Schools, and Leonard Falcone, director of bands at Michigan State University.

After the Edenton Band performs they will listen to other bands for the rest of the day, returning to Edenton about 10 o'clock Tuesday night.

Bill Is Introduced To Elect Members To School Board

Chowan County citizens will be interested to know that Representative Albert G. Byrum on Wednesday of last week introduced a bill in the House of Representatives having to do with the election of members of the County Board of Education.

The bill, HB-440, provides for the election at the 1961 general county election and biennially thereafter six members of the Board of Education for two-year terms. Nomination and elections are to be held at the same time and in the same manner as other county officers. The terms of the six new members recently appointed are to continue in office until their successors are elected and qualified.

Another bill introduced by Mr. Byrum on Wednesday designates successor trustees of the Edenton Academy created by Chapter 39, Public Laws of 1800, and amended by Chapter 4, Public Laws of 1844, and authorizing such trustees to execute conveyance of certain school property bounded by Queen and Church Streets in the Town of Edenton to the Edenton City Board of Education. As title indicates; designates William E. Bond, Joseph H. Conger, Jr., Junius W. Davis, J. E. Debnam, Jr., Richard F. El-

liott, John W. Graham, William P. Jones, James E. Wood and John Gilliam Wood, Jr., as trustees of named academy. In event property is sold by Edenton City School Board, proceeds must be used for purchasing of another school site or for such other educational purposes as board may determine.

Cancer Drive Is Now In Progress

With the month of April set aside by Congress to raise funds for research, education and special assistance in the fight against cancer, the local campaign is now in progress.

People are being helped right here in Chowan County by the American Cancer Society. Forty per cent of all funds received during this crusade will be returned to Chowan County for treatment of cancer patients and education.

Crusade dollars are spent to keep doctors up-to-date on new cancer diagnosis and treatment techniques. They bring free dressings and comfort to cancer patients. They support a nationwide program of cancer research being conducted by more than 1,000 senior scientists in leading hospitals, laboratories and universities. They train young scientists to fight cancer in research laboratories in this state and elsewhere.

Mrs. J. D. Elliott, Chowan County Chairman, also points out that only accidents kill more youngsters than does cancer. The American Cancer Society is currently spending over 1,500,000 per year for research related to leukemia. Millions of dollars

more must be invested to defeat this enemy which kills 2,000 children and 9,000 adults each year. Mrs. Elliott stresses: Be alert to Cancers Seven Danger Signals:

1. Unusual bleeding or discharge.
2. A lump or thickening in the breast or elsewhere.
3. A sore that does not heal.
4. Change in bowel or bladder habits.
5. Hoarseness or cough.
6. Indigestion or difficulty in swallowing.

7. Change in a wart or mole. "If your signal lasts longer than two weeks, go to your doctor to find out if it means cancer," says Mrs. Elliott.

A house to house canvass is being conducted and it is hoped contributions will be generous.
