

### Federal Law Prohibits Work On Farm Under 16 During School

State Labor Commissioner Frank Crane today cautioned Tar Heel farmers against employing youngsters under 16 years of age in farm work during local school hours.

"Such employment is prohibited by the child labor provisions of the Federal Wage and Hour Law, except where the farmer's own children work on his own farm," Crane said.

The law applies to all youngsters under 16, regardless of whether they are North Carolina residents or migrants from another State, he added. Crane said there is no age requirements for employment of young people in agriculture before or after local school hours, on Saturdays and Sundays, or during regular school holidays and vacations.

"If a farmer's or producer's products move, directly or indirectly, out of the State where they are grown, he is subject to this law," Commissioner Crane explained. "It is the farmer's responsibility to find out the correct age of each young worker he employs.

"The farmer is protected against unintentional violation of the law if he requires, and keeps on file, an official age certificate (Form D.L. 7) showing the young worker to be at least 16. These are issued by County Superintendents of Public Welfare."

Requirements of the federal law parallel and reinforce the N. C. Compulsory School Attendance Law, which requires that children attend school until they are 16 years of age, Crane said.

The Labor Commissioner urged farmers who are in doubt about the application of the law to inquire at the Wage and Hour Office in the State Department of Labor at Raleigh.
