## State's Peanut Production Up

Based on condition and probable yield reports from growers as of October 1, peanut production is forecast at 324,850,000 pounds, up 1.4 percent from September 1, according to the North Carolina Crop Reporting Service. Yield per acre, indicated at 1,825 pounds, is 35 pounds below the record yield produced in 1958. Generally, weather conditions have been favorable for digging operations. Yields on most of the acreage which has been combined are turning out above average.

**SWEET POTATO PRODUCTION ESTIMATE IS UNCHANGED**  
Based on probable yield reports from growers as of October 1, production of sweet potatoes is estimated at 2,263,000 hundred-weight, and is unchanged from a month earlier, according to the North Carolina Crop Reporting Service. Yield per acre at 73 hundred-weight is 2 hundred-weight below the 1958 yield, but is 12 hundred-weight above average.
