

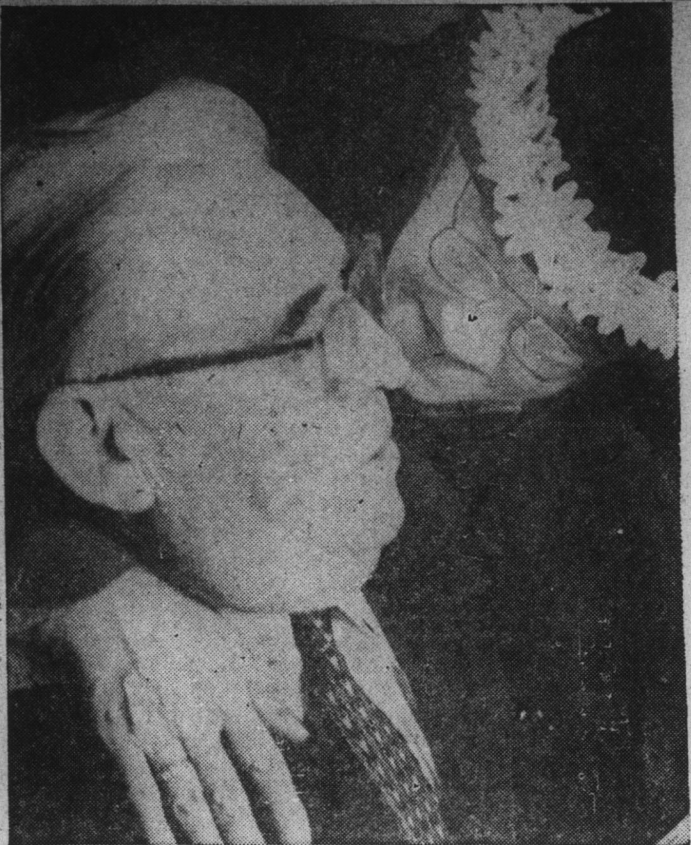
First Catholic Spiritual Retreat To Be Held In Edenton Planned

For the first time ever, members of St. Ann's Catholic Church have the privilege of a spiritual retreat in their own vicinity. A retreat being a spiritual inventory surrounded by an atmosphere of quiet and seclusion usually involves travel but the Albemarle area has been blessed by the recent arrival of an outstanding retreatmaster, the Rev. Francis Donnellan S.S.E., as the new pastor of St. Catherine's Church, Elizabeth City.

Father Donnellan will come to Edenton and open the retreat with the first conference at 8 P. M., on Saturday, November 7. He will also speak at the 8 and 11 o'clock masses on Sunday and after a parish buffet lunch at noon the final conference will be given at 1 P. M. During the Sunday afternoon conference a religious movie will be shown to the children in the recently completed Parish Hall.

Residents of Edenton and the surrounding area are invited to attend these conferences, even though they are not regular members of St. Ann's Church, without cost or obligation. It is

hoped that a great many people will take advantage of this rare opportunity to hear such a gifted and experienced authority on the spiritual life and profit not only from the talks given but even more from the hours between the talks which should be devoted to serious and honest self-introspection. For, as the name spiritual retreat implies, it has a striking resemblance to an effective military tactic. Just as in a battle retreat is sometimes the wiser course; so in one's spiritual life it is wise at times to draw back from the battle in order to get a clearer view of the enemy, to regroup one's forces and plan the best strategy. A soldier fights best when he knows who, how, and why he is fighting; hence the retreat conferences deal with Heaven, Hell, sin, prayer and virtues. A sincere, honest, objective look at one's self, accompanied by fervent prayer can change the course of one's life and obtain from God the grace to win the biggest battle of life, one's eternal salvation.

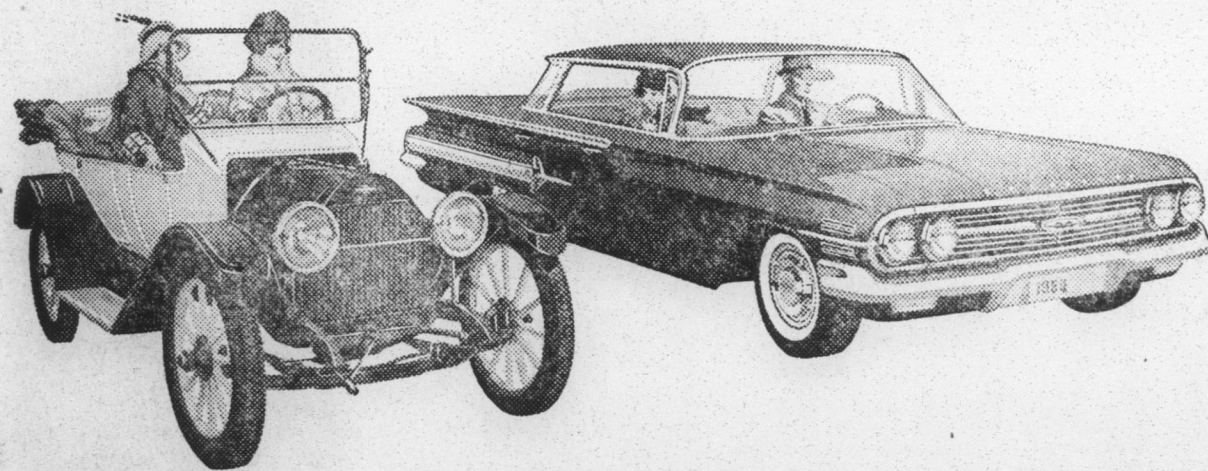

The National Outlook Do We Need Anti-Strike Legislation?

Late last week it appeared that the steel workers would be back on the job as of now. No matter when the strike ends, however, it will be months before the economy, the workers, and the companies fully recover. The hoped for ending of the strike was the result of the injunction obtained by the Administration requiring the steel employees to return to their jobs. Under the law, sixty days after the return to work, a secret vote must be taken of the employees on the final offer of the companies. If this offer is accepted, the strike is over for the duration of the contract. If the offer is voted down, the strike may be resumed twenty days later.

At Time Of Reopening Congress

Should such a resumption of the strike occur it would come just as the new session of the Congress is getting under way. This would mean that there would be enormous pressure to pass some kind of law to make it impossible for the public welfare to be undermined in such a manner. Among the suggestions which would be made are:

1. Prohibit all strikes in basic industries. This is unworkable. In the first place the determination of a basic industry is not easy, and secondly, and more important, the right to strike is basic in so far as private industry is concerned and it must not be prohibited.

2. Provide for the appointment of fact finding commissions with the authority to make recommendations. Fact finding commissions today do not have the right and it should not be given to them. They do not know, and cannot find out, as much about the issues in a labor controversy as the immediate parties. And unless the recommendations are made compulsory, there is no reason to assume that such power would settle the

dispute. If the recommendations are made compulsory, it means what is called compulsory arbitration. Such arbitration is used in the interpretation of provisions in an existing contract, but it must not be used as a general method for settling labor disputes.

3. Give the Federal Government authority to settle a strike when it has continued beyond a specified time. This would destroy collective bargaining. Such settlements necessarily would be made on a political, rather than an economic, basis.

4. Subject the unions to the anti-trust laws, or their equivalent. This would have the effect of eliminating the power of one person, or a small group of persons, to bring down a whole industry. We would not think of permitting the companies of an industry to get together and jointly decide that on a given day all will stop production. But that would be no worse from the viewpoint of public welfare than leaving with union leaders the power to strike a whole industry.

Congress May Be Forced To Act

As of the moment one has to say that the chance of the Congress eliminating this monopoly power of labor union chiefs is not great. But should the steel strike be resumed, and the public become aroused, it is possible that the Congress might move in this direction. Certainly nothing else will serve as any real protection to the public from the continued and repeated monopoly actions of the preferred few in the labor union movement.

Proper Washing for Sweaters—Wash sweaters before they are badly soiled.

Remove fancy buttons, ornaments or trimmings, as well as shoulder pads, before washing.

Make an outline of sweater on heavy paper or a Turkish towel before washing. Of course this is not necessary if a drying form is used.

Do not soak colored sweaters. Wash quickly and gently by hand. Squeeze suds through sweater. Do not rub hard or twist. Gentle action must be used particularly with woolsens to avoid shrinkage. Soiled spots can be treated by working in some of the top suds with the fingers.

Rinse thoroughly in clear, lukewarm water. Squeeze out as much water as possible.

Roll sweater in Turkish towel and knead gently to remove excess moisture.

Unroll immediately and lay sweater on outline, stretching to size or place on drying form.

Separate contrasting colors with dry towel inserted between back and front panels of sweater and then dry quickly in front of a fan or in some airy place away from heat. When entirely dry, brush angoras or other fleecy types to fluff up nap.

Family Financial Planning

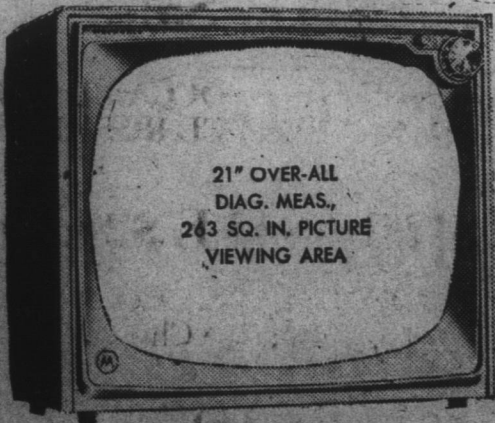
