The dart is a plastic syringe encased in metal and loaded with nicotine. It's fired from a special air rifle that loads like a single-shot shotgun and is powered by a compressed

Farmers, ranchers, 200 keepers, veterinarians, and big-game hunters use the rifle. They can fire it from as far as 75 yards away and score an effective hit, but best results are obtained from a distance of about 25 yards. When the dart strikes the animal, a small compressed air cartridge is activated and the nicotine is injected into the bloodstream. In a few minutes the bull will stagger and then drop to the ground, paralyzed. Then the farmer can administer medicine that the animal may need.

The treatment is relatively painless for the animal. It appears to suffer little, either problem
