Continued from Page 1, Section 1 bearing on absenteeism. They also know that nothing breeds illness like unsanitary surroundings. When we have an adequate sewage disposal system, we will be in a much better position to attract industry, thus bringing more revenue to Edenton and its citizens.

With the idea of attracting new industry to our town, we must also consider the water supply, which is not unlimited. Billions of gallons of water are contaminated in our bay area, due to the emptying of the city's raw sewage into it. Contaminated water means water that cannot be used unless it is treated through the proper facilities. Consequently, the overall water supply for Edenton is reduced by the fact that proper facilities are not available to process properly the huge quantities of contaminated water on hand. Per capita consumption of water, in the United States, has risen from 122 gallons in 1940 to 150 gallons in 1960, and is expected to rise to 165 gallons in 1975.

Five gallons are needed daily to wash our hands, face, shave, and brush our teeth. Every flush of the toilet requires seven gallons of water. Washing machines, air conditioners, garbage disposals, and dishwashers create heavy demands. Edenton's water problems will be solved with the elimination of the contaminated water in our bay area. Better health, better sanitation and better living are permanent conditions which will continue for generations in Edenton after the pollution abatement bonds have been paid in full. Consideration of these dividends to us, your city councilmen, that the time has come for a change. Vote Yes on the (Sewer) bond issue November 21, 1961.
