### Health For All

#### QUACK

"See a doctor—but be sure he IS a doctor."

One of the best pieces of medical advice anyone can get is, "See a doctor." When you feel sick, don't trust yourself to diagnose the trouble. A doctor can do it much better. That is what he has been trained to do.

But there is a second piece of advice that should always go with the rule: "But be sure he IS a doctor."

Every year, the American public spends millions of dollars on medical quacks—bogus doctors with bogus methods. They use seemingly wonderful, unheard of machines and mysterious, secret formulas. At best, these quack remedies are simply harmless; at worst, they can be extremely dangerous.

A quack promises cures, even for incurable diseases. He is generally anti-doctor and anti-medical associations. He is also opposed to proven methods of treatment. He probably advertises (something a bona fide doctor would never do), and he often talks freely—brags, in fact—about the cures he has effected.

But the worst thing of all about a quack is the time he wastes, time when the patient could be undergoing valid treatment from a genuine doctor. Time that, in some cases, might mean the difference between life and death.

So, if you aren't feeling well,

don't dose yourself. See a doctor—and be sure he IS a doctor. Quacks are tor ducks.

### Record Acreage For Soybeans Is Expected

March 1, 1962 prospective acreage of soybeans grown alone for all purposes is indicated at a record of 796,000 acres, according to the North Carolina Crop Reporting Service. On the basis of the March intentions, the current crop acreage is expected to be 10 percent above the record plantings in 1961 and 68 percent above the 1951-60 average.

With the exception of 1959, some increase in acreage has occurred each year since 1953.

### '62 Cotton Acreage Same As Last Year

Based on reports from growers as of March 1 and other information, North Carolina farmers intend to plant 420,000 acres of cotton in 1962, according to the North Carolina Crop Reporting Service. This is the same as the planted acreage in 1961.

The 1962 allotment for North Carolina is about 1 percent smaller than 1961. Growers with farms having allotments who do not intend to plant cotton in 1962 have been asked to release their acreage and this acreage will be reapportioned to farmers desiring additional acreage.
