Wake Church - Going a Habit

Sunday School Lesson

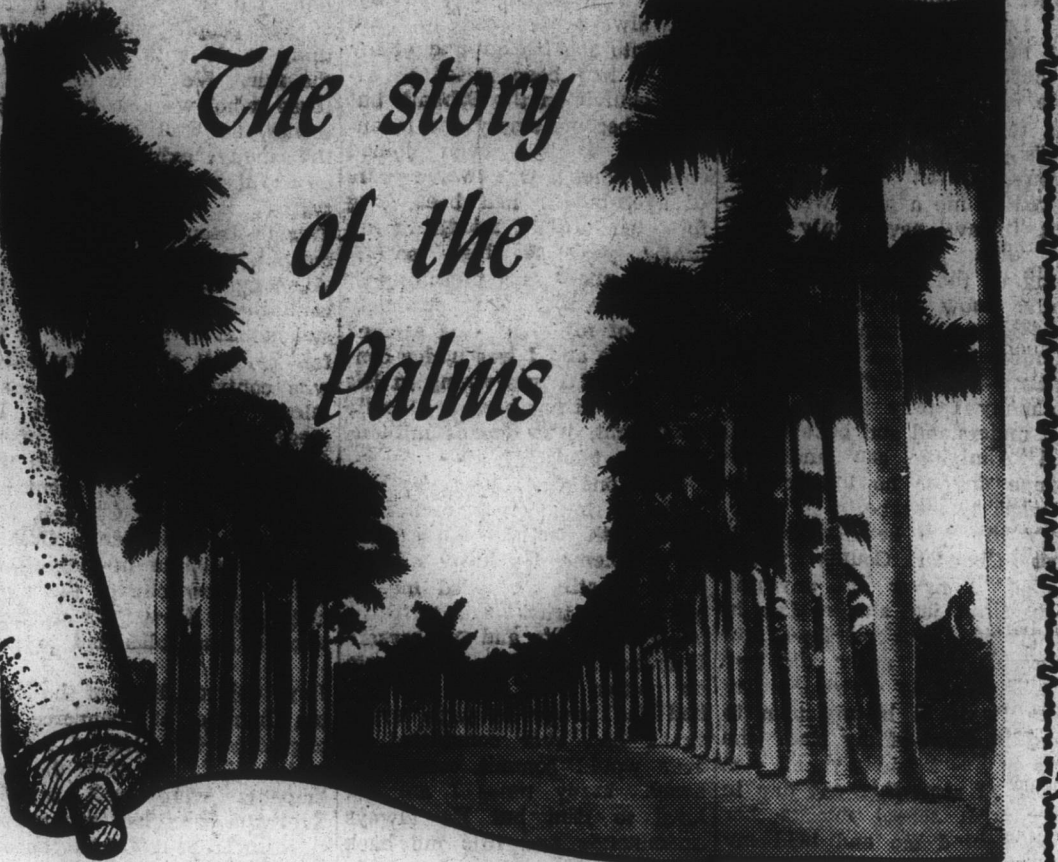
THE CROSS CALLS US
International Sunday School Lesson for April 15, 1962.

Memory Selection: "I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me; and the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me." (Galatians 2:20)

Lesson Text: Titus.
In this lesson we explore the meaning of divine grace, regeneration and renewal, and the call of the cross in terms of life today.

Titus, the shortest of the three pastoral letters, is much like First Timothy in content. The situation reflected in the Letter, however, indicates a second-century stage in the development of the early Christian church. The purpose of this Letter was to set down the qualifications of bishops and to warn against false teachers. In contrast with the immorality tolerated by the latter, the au-

thor described true Christian behavior and spelled out the attitudes a Christian needs to possess.
"Grace," "Salvation" and "Regeneration" are the three words which stand out in our lesson for today. Grace designates the principle underlying man's salvation through Jesus Christ. Salvation is God's gift to all sinners. Although we do not merit it, God is unconstrained as he bestows it. Divine grace is given spontaneously and generously. In granting us his grace God completely sets aside all legal and conventional requirements. Grace is God's way of meeting and conquering man's sin. It excludes all thought that man can earn God's blessing by establishing a righteousness of his own. Grace also supersedes futile "works" as a way of meriting salvation. This is made clear in Titus 2:11, where it states that "the grace of God has appeared for the salvation of all men."
Yet the bestowal of God's grace does not mean that men are freed from the duty of doing good. It is customary, Continued on Page 7—Section 2
