Two Edentonians Get Teaching Assignment

East Carolina College's student teaching program for the spring quarter includes 226 seniors who are conducting classes in more than thirty public schools in Eastern North Carolina. Eighty-five are doing work in the primary and grammar grades, 122 in high schools, and nineteen are teaching either art or music at all grade levels.

Of the total number of students participating in the program 220 are from North Carolina, and six are from other states.

Assignments of seniors at the college who are now gaining experience as classroom instructors have been announced by Dr. J. L. Oppelt, director of student teaching at East Carolina.

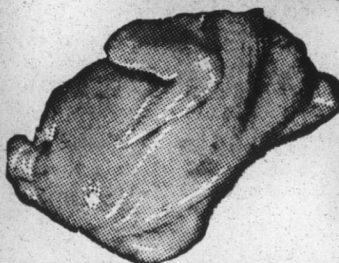
