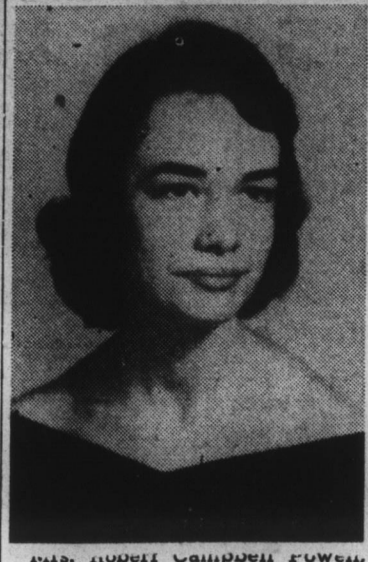

## Leroy Spivey Hurt In Auto Accident

Leroy Spivey of Edenton was injured about the face Saturday morning when the car in which he was riding was involved in an accident at the corner of West Queen and South Mosley Streets.

Spivey's father, E. L. Spivey, was the driver of the car which was struck while going west on Queen Street, by a car being driven by Casper Overton of Edenton. Overton failed to stop while going north on Mosley Street and entered the intersection, striking the left front of Spivey's car. Both automobiles left the road before stopping.

It was the second such accident to occur at the corner within the past three weeks. Mrs. Cecil W. Fry was struck almost identically by Charlie Copeland of Tyner when Copeland failed to yield the right of way coming south on Mosley Street just two weeks before Saturday's collision. Police estimated damages to Spivey's 1952 Ford at \$400 while Overton's 1954 Plymouth sustained about \$250 damage. Leroy Spivey had several stitches taken in his bottom lip and suffered a chipped tooth.
