Donald W. Norman, County Supervisor of the Farmers Home Administration in Camden, Chowan, Currituck, Pasquotank and Perquimans counties stated this week that his agency had received 127 initial applications for FHA services. He said these applications were for purchasing tractors and equipment, purchasing livestock, developing and improving farms. purchasing farms, refinancing debts on farm property, building new homes and repairing old homes. Applications received this fiscal year were 300% greater than the number received two years ago.

Fifty-nine loans totaling \$315,-970.00 were made during the past fiscal year ending June 30, 1962. Norman stated that eleven additional loans totaling \$139,-850.00 were processed during the year and would be approved after July 1, 1962.

Collections this past fiscal year totaled \$210,950.00, an increase of 100% over collections two years ago. Norman stated this was due to good debt repayment last fall and an increase in the amount of money
