Commercial fishermen will be permitted to set pound nets and gill nets in Chowan River as near as 150 yards of the mouth of any of the tributary creeks and will be permitted to use three-inch gill nets throughout the year in that part of Albemarle Sound lying to the eastward of the Norfolk and Southern Railroad bridge, upon approval of the September 8 action of the Commercial Fisheries Committee by the Board of Conservation & Development in Oc-

At present, nets may not be set within 300 yards of the and within 400 yards between April 25 and July 1. Gill nets of less than three and one-half inch mesh may not be used between July 1 and January 1 east of the Norfolk and Southern bridge in Albemarle Sound.
