

## AROUND THE FARMS IN CHOWAN COUNTY

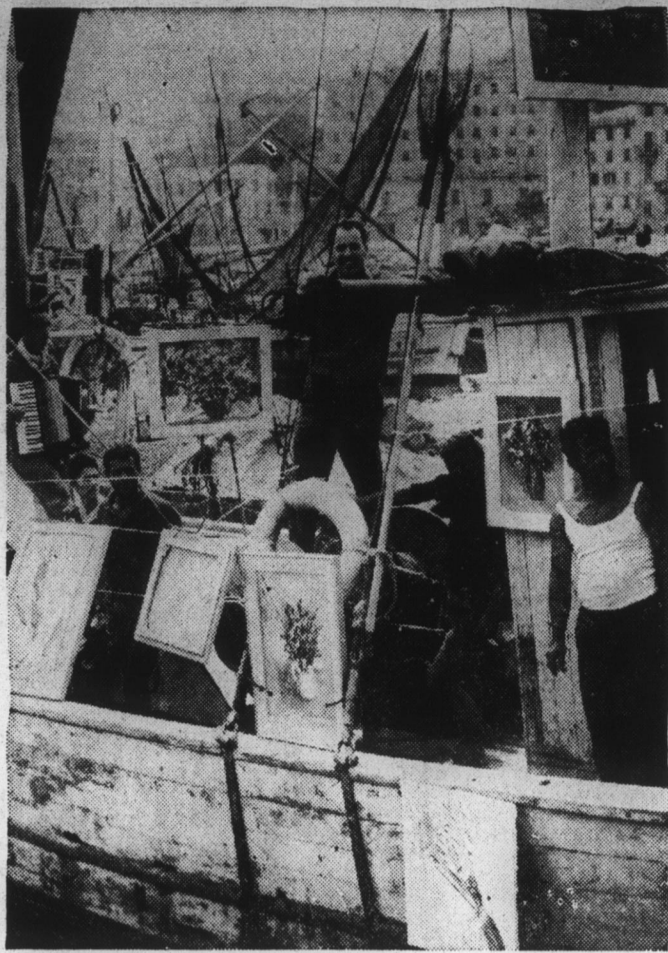

**Scale Appearing On Shrubs:** a watery, reddish brown liquid. Florida Wax Scale as well as other type scale insects are appearing on many shrubs. Now is the time to start the control program on these pests before they do severe damage.

Florida Wax Scale appears as a white lumpy spot, ranging up to the size of a lead pencil. When you pinch the lump off you will find a dark spot underneath. When mashed it shows

Other scale insects appear as small, whitish gray to light brown specks or small spots on the stems and leaves.

To control these pests a thorough spraying with malathion in soapy water is good. To a gallon of warm water mix 1 to 2 tablespoonsful of liquid soap or detergent and to this add 2 to 3 tablespoonsful of 25% Ec

must be wet with the spray. Repeat the application at ten day to two week intervals until the pests are eliminated.

**Water System Worked Out For Cattle Feeding Operation:** Mr. John Thomas of Perlin Packing Company was assisted by the County Agent and Mr. Ronald E. Sneed, Extension agricultural engineer, in working out plans for a water system to serve the cattle feeding operation facility now under construction in the Yeopim area. Mr. Thomas now has 18 feeding pens located on one of the concrete runways of the abandoned air facility. Mr. Thomas plans to put

in approximately 1800 feeder cattle within the next thirty days.

**North Carolina-Virginia Peanut Cooperative Holds Annual Meeting:** The North Carolina-Virginia Peanut Growers Cooperative held its annual meeting at the armory in Ahoskie Tuesday. In the report given by the executive secretary it was noted that market conditions were such that very few peanuts were taken under loan by the cooperative last year. The cooperative is equipped for the 1962 marketing season with what appears to be ample warehouse space in the event the loan program is need-

ed. This is certainly a most worthwhile safety enterprise for peanut growers.

**Plans For County Fair Near Completion:** The Chowan County Agricultural Workers Council met on Wednesday afternoon at the county Extension office. Plans were nearly completed for the Chowan County Fair scheduled to be held October 1-6. Final plans were made for community judging in the 1962 community development contest in Chowan County. Plans were also made for area judging in community development.

Another in a series of articles in which the North Carolina Department of Motor Vehicles explores some of the significant facts behind last year's traffic accident toll.

North Carolina suffered 1,250 traffic casualties last year as listed by the State Department of Motor Vehicles. Most of the deaths came from excessive speed. In a special breakdown of speeding cases that resulted in fatal smash ups, the agency said the picture looked like this: Speeding under \*65.....149 wrecks Speeding \*65-75.....150 wrecks Speeding over \*75.....137 wrecks

\*Denotes miles per hour. As a footnote the vehicles department added that with good brakes on average pavement it takes 371 feet of space to come to a stop from 75 miles an hour.
