



School Progress

Many Subjects Being Taught Earlier In Grades

Public demand for better schools, along with the rise in college admission standards and the scientific achievements of the Soviet Union, has produced marked improvement and development in education, according to Changing Times, the Kiplinger Magazine.

Citing a recent survey of 1,500 elementary and secondary school principals, an article in the current issue of the magazine states that in the last five years schools have begun placing a stronger emphasis on basic subjects-science, math and foreign languages — and, in elementary schools, on the fundamentalsreading, writing, spelling and arithmetic.

"The old self-contained classroom is disappearing; so is the grade system," according to Changing Times. "Many elementary and secondary schools now tend to group students by ability rather than age or grade, and many lower schools are experimenting with no grades at all."

In addition, the article notes, many subjects are being taught earlier, with elementary grades receiving science, social studies and even some algebra, and high school subjects are being moved

As for the students, the survey found most principals in agreement that the work demanded of pupils has increased and that there will be a growing pressure for still more work






