

## Edenton Aces Prepare To Meet Yellow Jackets Friday Night

Edenton's Aces are scheduled to meet one of their arch rivals Friday night, October 5, when they clash with the Yellow Jackets of Elizabeth City on the latter's gridiron at 8 o'clock.

The Aces have won two games and lost one, so that they will be out to avenge last year's heartbreaking 7-6 defeat. Coach Jerry McGee will also be very anxious to defeat a Honey Johnson coached aggregation, for he at one time was a Yellow Jacket player under Coach Johnson.

The Aces and Yellow Jackets have been keen football rivals since 1926 and during that period have played 34 games. The Yellow Jackets, of course, hold a decided edge, for of the 34

games played they have won 27 of them.

Though the Yellow Jackets are in a stronger conference, the Aces are hopeful they can add another victory to their column.

The Aces are in good physical condition and this week Coaches McGee and Billy Hardison are taking them through strenuous practice sessions in order to be in the best possible shape.

A large crowd of Edenton supporters are expected to accompany the Aces to Elizabeth City. Principal Cecil Fry announces that all tickets at the gate will be \$1.00 but that a batch of students' tickets have been sent to Edenton which can be purchased for 50 cents.

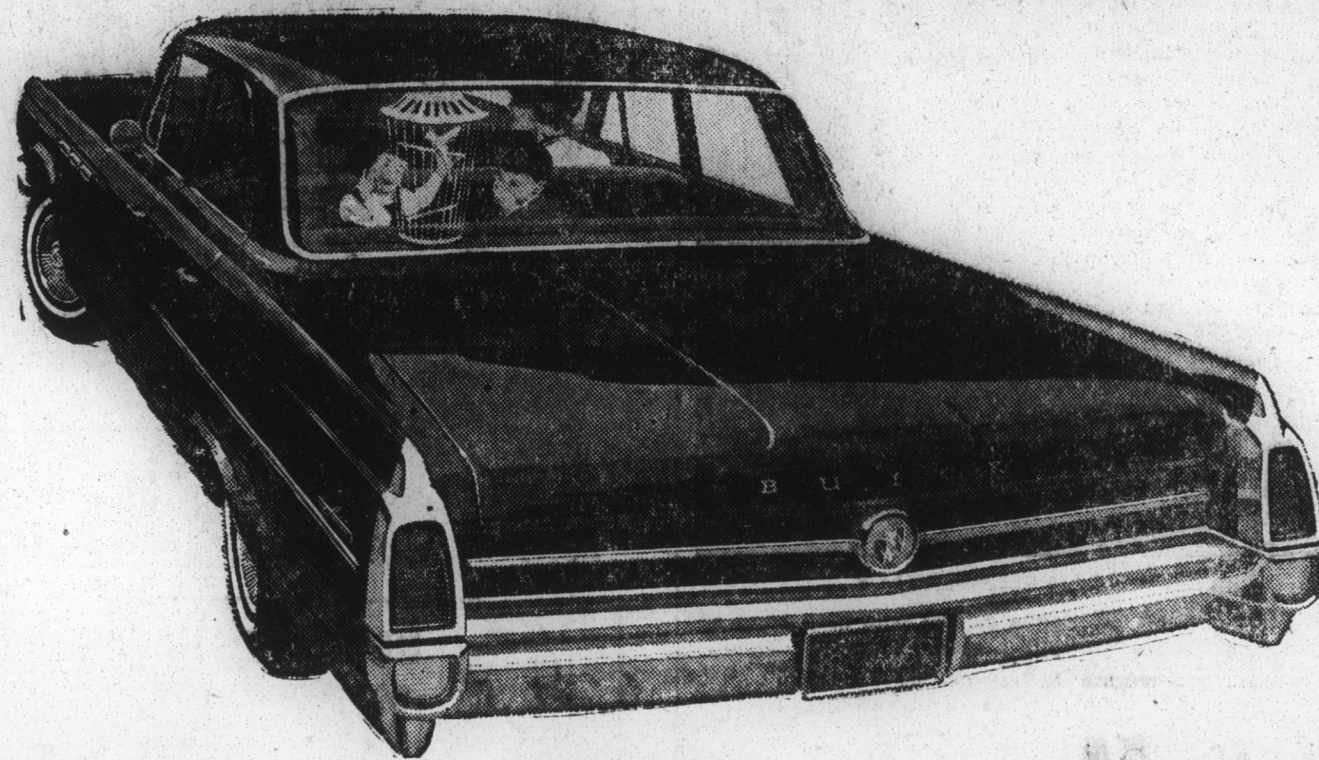

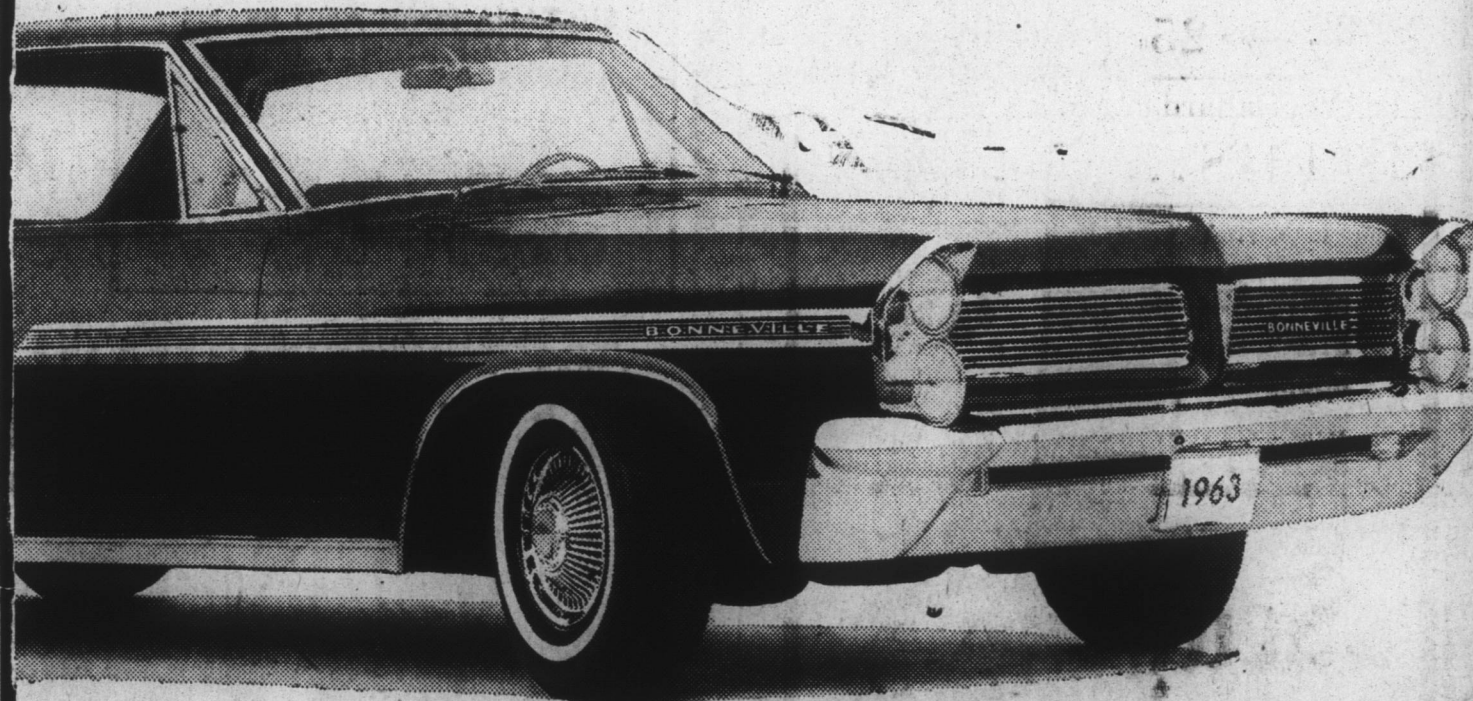

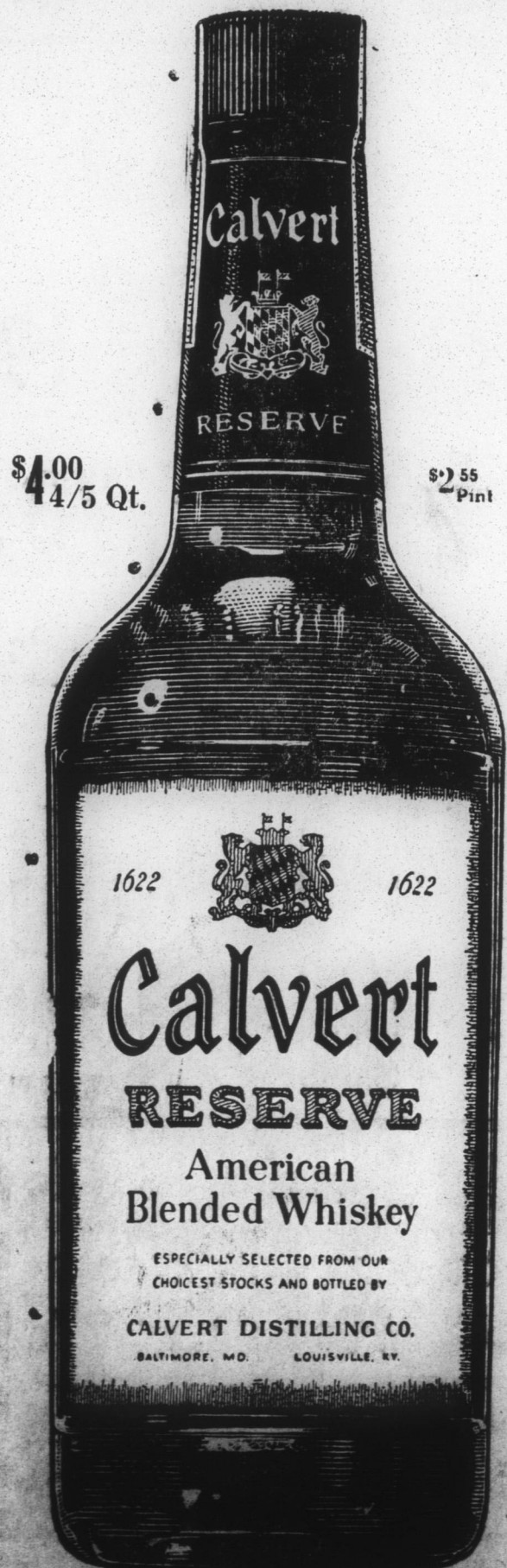
