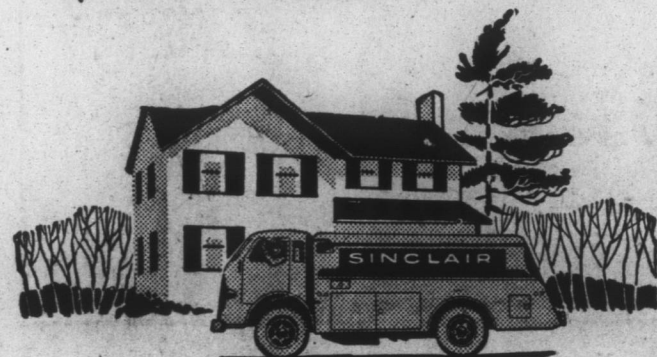
Grace Fogler of Goldsboro, a state officer, will be guests at the breakfast.

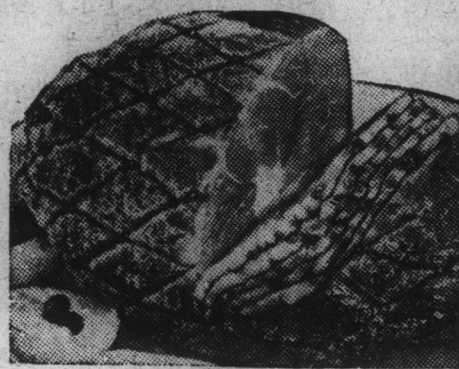

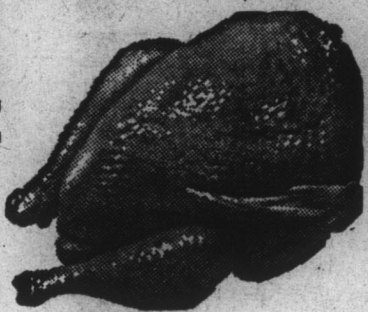

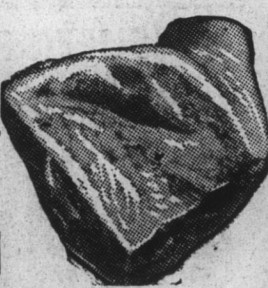
