The awards were presented by Governor Terry Sanford at a public subscription dinner held at Hotel Sir Walter which was attended by about 300 people.

Mrs. Fletcher received the medal for literature in recognition of her famed Carolina series, a succession of 12 novels which began in 1940 with Raleigh's Eden. Her latest novel is Rogue's Harbor.

Mrs. Fletcher's novels have circled the world and have been translated into many languages. Through her novels she has helped to bring North Carolina history to life and this in turn has helped to inspire interest in the history of the state. She has also taken an active part in the preservation, restoration and beautification of monuments of North Carolina heritage.

Since Mrs. Fletcher's home, Bandon Plantation, was destroyed by fire, she has been making her home with her sister, Mrs. L. A. Chenoweth at Belvidere.
