



Ranger 7 took off from Cape Kennedy, Florida, at about midday Tuesday, July 28, and crashlanded on the Moon early in the morning of Friday, July 31, having traveled almost a quarter of a million miles through space. Six television cameras in the spaceship started taking pictures of the Moon's surface at the point where the range of the largest telescope on Earth ends From that point on, until the spaceship crashed, the six cameras transmitted about 4,300 pictures of the Moon.

The result: whereas man, with is most powerful telescope, preiously had been able to discern craters on the Moon no smaller than a quarter of a mile in diameter, he can now see craters as small as three feet in diameter.
