Mrs. Billy Pruden recently sent me one of her favorite ways of making an inexpensive gift or to use at home as sort of a sachet. Pomander Balls Six large firm oranges, powdered orris root and ground cinnamon. Select firm oranges for making pomanders. Stick whole cloves into the peel of the orange until completely covered with cloves. Roll in a mixture of equal parts of orris root and cinnamon. Use about 1½ teaspoons of the combined spices for each orange. Pat in as much of the mixture as will adhere to the orange, then wrap the pomander in tissue or cellophane paper. As the pomander dries and shrinks, it develops its spicy fragrance. Remove it from paper, shake off any loose powder and the pomander is ready for use in linen and clothes closets. Pomanders keep their fragrance for many years and really do make nice gifts.
