As a service of the laity, for 79 years this day of prayer has given Christian witness through re-dedication and mission, person to person, race to race and nation to nation.

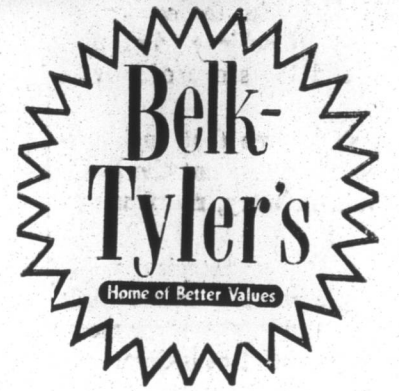

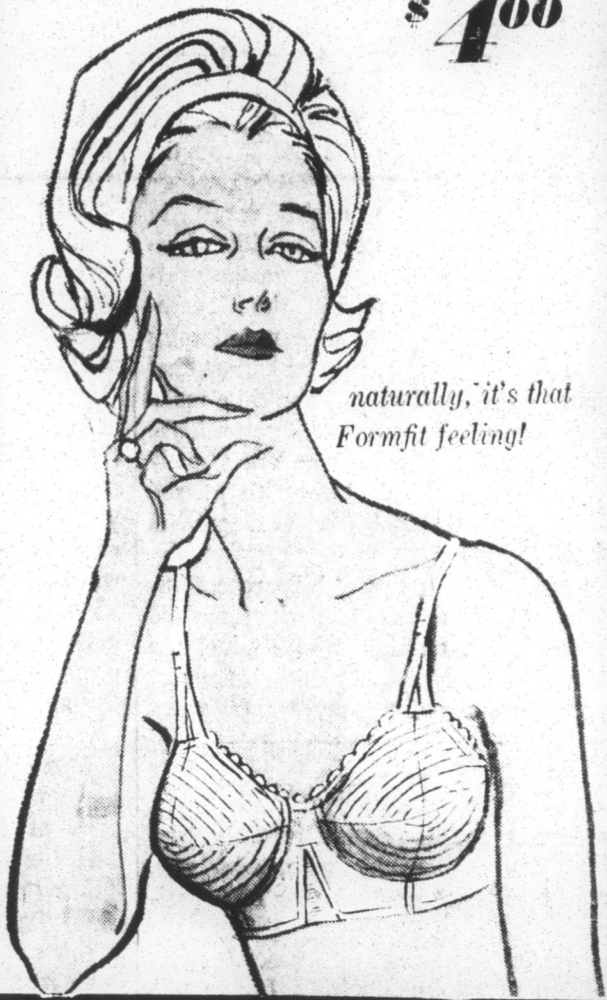

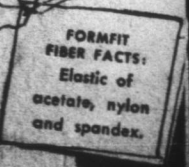
