## Quota In Sight For Heart Fund

Tom Shepard, Chowan County chairman of the Heart Fund drive, reports preliminary return of a total of \$1,477.88. "There are still four rural communities to be heard from, and one district in the house-to-house canvas, so it looks pretty certain Chowan County will surpass its quota of \$1,500," he said.

"All of us associated with the drive," Shepard said, "are deeply grateful for the fine cooperation we have received from everyone. It is this kind of spirit that makes working in this kind of campaign most worthwhile."

Although the campaign of February is over, Shepard stressed the necessity for thinking about the purpose of the Heart Fund is not. As a reminder of the importance of continuing to keep the principal safeguards against heart disease in mind, Shepard named the following points:

1. Reduce if overweight.
  2. Reduce fat consumption.
  3. Control high blood pressure.
  4. Stop smoking cigarettes.
  5. Exercise regularly.
  6. Shun needless tensions.
- "Heart Fund dollars," said Shepard "will continue to help in developing new knowledge to make improvements in the death rate from heart disease."

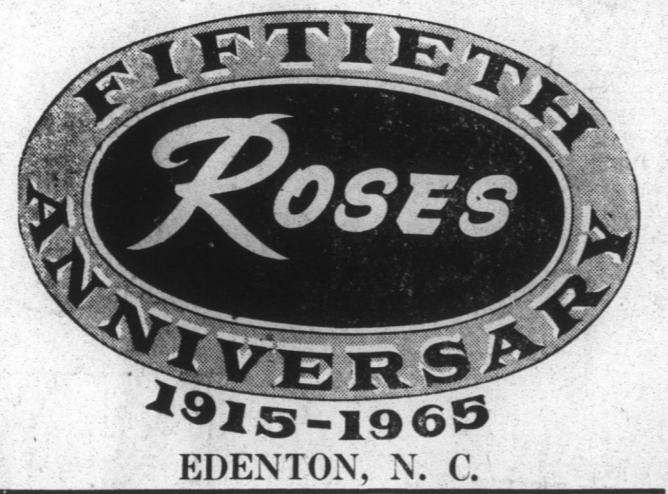
