Edenton, N. C., July 6, 1965.

The Board of Public Works met this day in regular session at 8 P. M., at Edenton Municipal Building. Members present: Jesse L. Harrell, chairman; J. H. Conger, Jr., Thomas C. Byrum, Jr., J. P. Ricks, Jr., and W. J. P. Earnhardt, Sr.

Chairman Harrell called the meeting to order and the minutes of the regular meeting of June 1, 1965 and the special meeting of June 24, 1965 were read and approved.

Motion was made by Thomas C. Byrum, Jr., seconded by J. H. Conger, Jr., and duly carried, approving E. and W. Dept. bills in the amount of \$20,889.73 for payment as follows:

Billing for electricity used will be monthly and on the commercial rate.

Mr. Hines reported on the problems in the Sewage Disposal Plans. Mr. Hines and Mr. Ricks were directed by the Board to make the necessary installations to bring the plant up to proper operation.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.

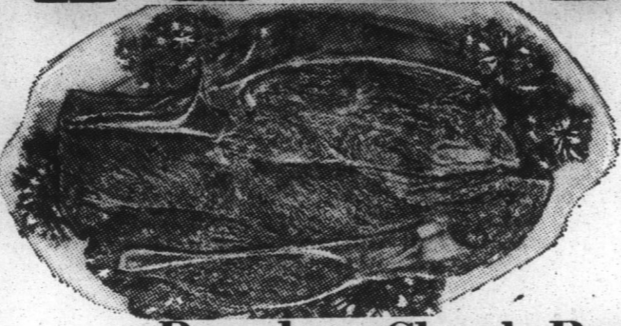
