



Student Homeroom Assignment Made At John A. Holmes High School

Homeroom assignments for the 1965-66 school term at John A. Holmes High School were released this week by Cecil W. Fry, principal.

There were 426 students registered in the seventh through 12th grades at the time the assignments were made.

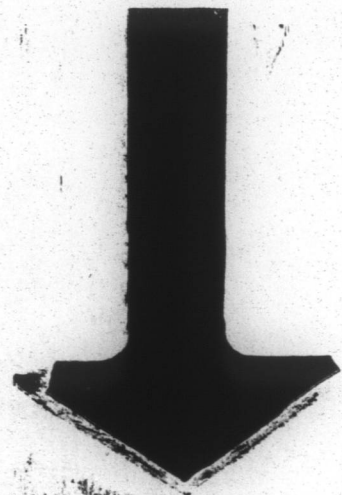
FAMILY OUTING
