I sure wasted my French on him.

presented for this goal. Wood stated that if the group took one project a year it would take 20 years to accomplish the area needs. "Our success lies in agreeing on a priority project and backing it to completion," he concluded.

Herbert Small of Elizabeth City, asked about the Elizabeth City urban loop road approved by the past commission. Wood said he and the committee assumed this project would be built.

The committee also passed a resolution asking the State Highway Commission to study carefully the Federal Highway Beautification Act before accepting any part of the program.

Too, the group will ask town councils and county commissioners throughout the Albemarle area to support the highway group's recommendations.

The next committee meeting will be held in Hertford early in January, 1966.

FOOD STAMP COUPONS — Eligible low-income families in Chowan County will begin using this new "currency" to buy their food at authorized retail food stores when the U. S. Department of Agriculture's new food stamp program for the needy gets underway November 1.

Stamp Program Slated

ROCKY MOUNT — The U. S. Department of Agriculture's food stamp program for needy families gets underway Monday, November 1, in Bertie and Chowan counties.

The county offices of the North Carolina State Board of Public Welfare are now taking applications from families wishing to take part in the new food program.

Sam W. Pope, food stamp program official of USDA's Consumer and Marketing Service at Rocky Mount, said today that 60 retail food merchants have been authorized to accept food stamp coupons from needy families in the two counties—45 in Bertie and 15 in Chowan.

Pope pointed out that grocers who have not been authorized to participate in the food stamp program cannot accept coupons from the needy families. He said any bonafide food retailer who has not applied, but is interested in taking part in the program, should contact his office at 228 South Church

Street, Rocky Mount, as soon as possible.

Grocers must wait until they have received their authorization cards and numbers before they can accept coupons from their customers. Pope said.

The food stamp program—administered jointly by the North Carolina State Board of Public Welfare and USDA's Consumer and Marketing Service—is a new food program designed to help low-income families buy more and better food at local food stores.

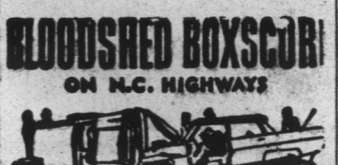
Beginning November 1, food coupons will be issued to families in Bertie and Chowan counties who have been determined by the county department of public welfare to be in economic need of food assistance. Other families also may receive food coupons, provided their family income does not exceed certain specified amounts worked out by the welfare department and the Consumer and Marketing

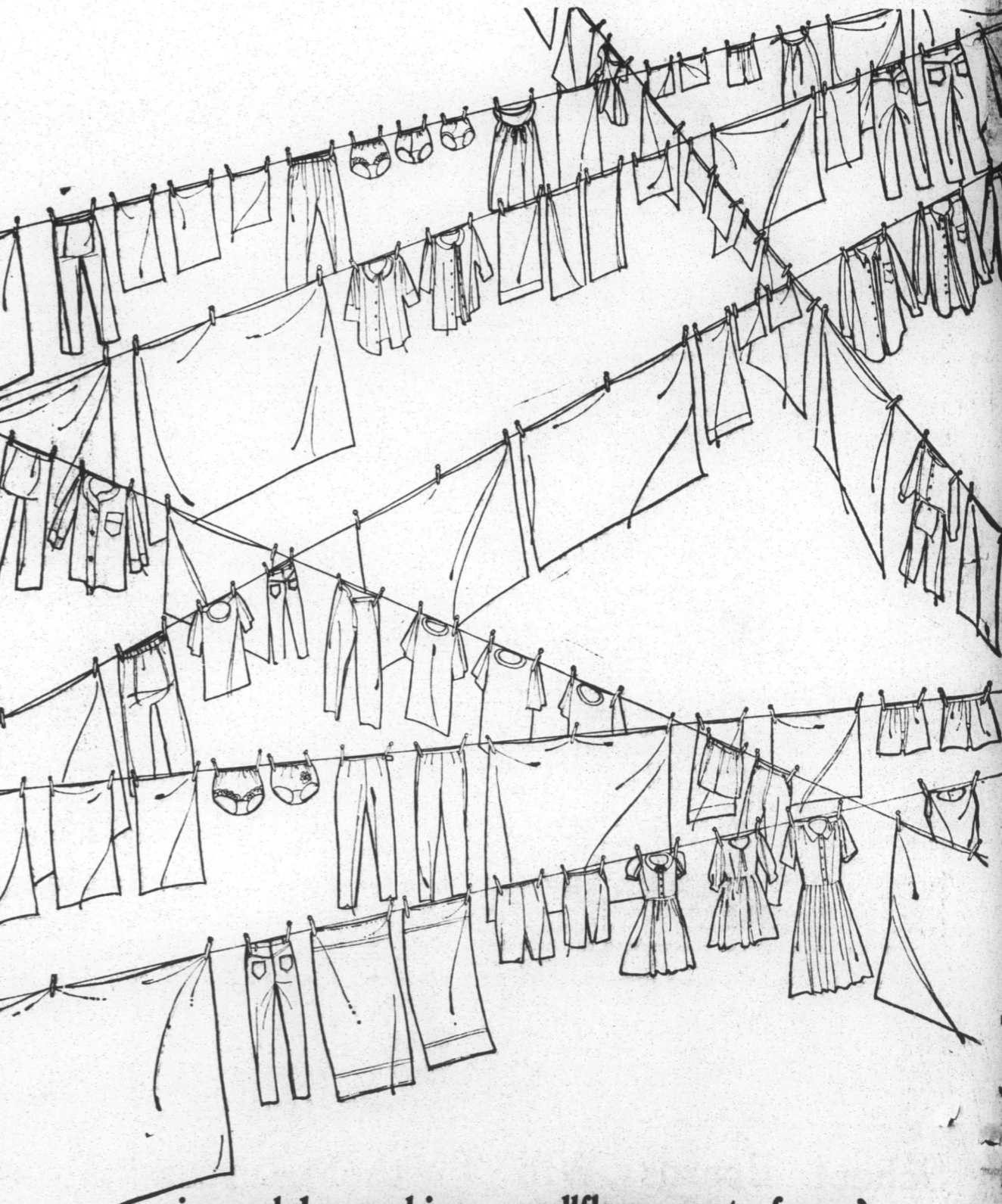

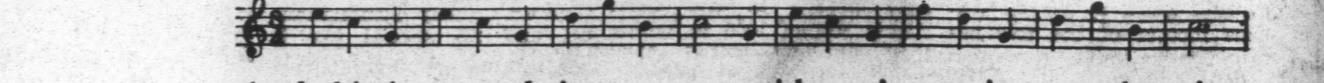

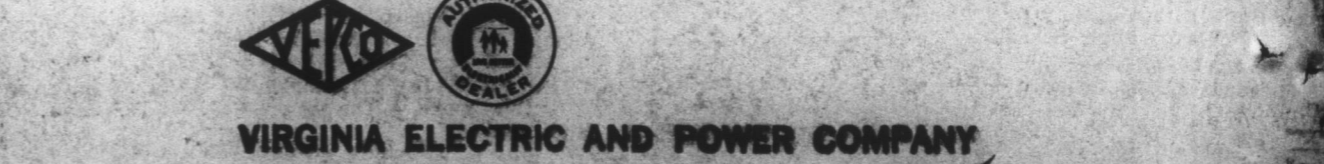
