

nancial participation. Part A of the Medicare program - basic hospital benefits - is automatic and requires no premium payment by the individual. This part provides inpatient and outpatient hospital services as well as post-hospital extended care and home health services. However, Part B is a vol-

untary program of medical services. The individual is required to pay \$3 per month to the government for protection under Part B. There are many other pro-

visions in the Medicare plan which local officials said would be discussed later. "We will pass all available
