

Students Vie For Belk Grants

College scholarships worth \$500 each will again be awarded to 36 deserving high school seniors by the Belk Foundation.

Alton Elmore, manager of Belk-Tyler's in Edenton, explained, in making the announcement today, that only those entering college for the first time in the fall of 1966 would be eligible to compete for the scholarships.

Elmore cited the increasing importance of college education, for the individual as well as for his community, as the reason the Belk Foundation has continued its scholarship program. He said that because the Belk group of department stores operate under an unusual plan of local control, they take a special interest in the citizens, and the areas surrounding each store. Each store feels a responsibility to contribute towards the betterment of its own community, since it is a dominant part of the business life in which it participates.

The Belk Foundation, established as a memorial to W. H. Belk and Dr. John M. Belk, founders of the Belk mercantile organization, has assisted many churches, colleges, hospitals and other institutions. Since 1958 it has awarded an increasing number of 5500 scholarships as an additional means of providing better opportunities in life.

The scholarships are available to high school graduates in the 18-state area served by the Belk, Leggett and Efid department stores. All persons who were graduated from high schools since January 1, 1960, may apply, provided they ranked scholastically in the upper one-third of their graduating class and will be entering college as freshmen during 1966.

Winners, who will select their own colleges and courses of study, will be selected by a committee appointed by the Belk Foundation. They will be named on the basis of scholastic rating, school and community activities, financial need, character and interests, and potentialities for success in college and adult life.

Proceedings Of Town Council

Edenton, N. C.
January 11, 1966

The Town Council of the Town of Edenton met this day in regular session at 8:00 P. M. in the Edenton Municipal Building.

Members present: Mayor John A. Mitchener, Jr., J. Edwin Bufflap, Luther C. Parks, J. D. Elliott, Henry G. Quinn, David G. White, and Leo Katkaveck.

Mayor Mitchener called the meeting to order and Councilman Bufflap gave the invocation.

Mayor Mitchener gave the oath of office to Chief of Police James H. Griffin and welcomed him to his new job.

Town Administrator W. B. Gardner reported to the Council that a request for a Traffic Engineer to help study the flow of traffic in the downtown business area has been requested and word from the Highway Department is expected in the very near future.

Two members of the Police Department are now attending school at the Coastal Plain Law Enforcement Academy at East Carolina College and Mr. Gardner also reported that the Chief of Police will attend henceforth all Merchants Committee meetings of the Chamber of Commerce in order to try to better understand and regulate police activities in the business district.

Motion by Luther C. Parks, seconded by J. D. Elliott and unanimously carried changing the following intersections from Stop to Yield:

- (1) First and Johnston
- (2) Second and Johnston
- (3) Third and Johnston
- (4) Cabarrus and First
- (5) Cabarrus and Second
- (6) Queen and Railroad
- (7) Church and Moseley
- (8) Badham and Second
- (9) Hawthorne and Stratford

Appropriate signs are to be erected as soon as possible.

The Street Department was complimented for the fine job just completed in constructing sidewalks around the Edenton Elementary School. One thousand and forty seven feet of sidewalk were constructed for a total cost of \$1,627.38.

Sinclair Refining Company which was the low bidder for the furnishing of gasoline and oil to the Town of Edenton, will install new dispensing equipment as soon as received.

Councilman Elliott reported that the bids for the Fire Station have been officially rejected and the architect has been requested to render his bill for services to date.

Report of the off-street parking committee was presented. Motion by Luther C. Parks, seconded by J. D. Elliott and unanimously carried approving the plan of the off street parking committee as presented and instructing them to carry out the various purchases proposed.

A Public Hearing will be held on Monday, January 24, 1966 for the purpose of discussing off street parking policy and of the re-zoning of the Tommy Jackson property located on West Eden Street from residential to neighborhood business.

Mr. Gardner presented a report on negotiations with United States Lumber Company stating the proposals offered by Mr. Lester in the re-negotiations. The Council unanimously rejected these proposals and directed Attorney W. S. Privott to proceed with Court action as soon as possible.

Councilman Quinn recommended endorsement by the Town Council of a proposition to locate the Alcoholic Rehabilitation Center for Eastern North Carolina in Chowan County. State Senator Walter B. Jones is chairman of the Site Committee and is to be contacted by a

committee of the Council to arrange a satisfactory date for a meeting to discuss a proposal of the Town and the County. This rehabilitation center was brought about by an act passed by the 1965 General Assembly. The Council unanimously approved Mr. Quinn's recommendation and instructed the Mayor to appoint a committee to meet with Mr. Jones at the earliest possible date.

The Board of Public Works requested the Town's approval of the purchase of property owned by G. B. Potter on West Freeman Street adjacent to the Electric and Water Department Plant for a price of \$6,000.00. Motion by D. G. White, seconded by Henry G. Quinn and unanimously carried approving the recommendation of the Electric and Water Department.

Motion by Luther C. Parks, seconded by J. Edwin Bufflap and unanimously carried awarding the following franchises for the operation of taxicabs to the Town of Edenton for the year 1966:

- (1) John Roberts, one taxicab;
- (2) Caley Rountree, one taxicab;
- (3) Mrs. Lillian J. Roberts, one taxicab; and
- (4) Mary R. Jernigan, two taxicabs.

Motion by J. D. Elliott, seconded by D. G. White and unanimously carried approving E&W Dept. bills in the amount of \$22,827.66 for payment.

Motion by J. Edwin Bufflap, seconded by J. D. Elliott and unanimously carried approving Town of Edenton bills in the amount of \$9,424.75 for payment as follows:
